Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FEBRUARY 27, 2022

Sirach 27:4-7; 1 Corinthians 15:54-58; Luke 6:39-45

How often we open our mouths to insert our feet! The author of the first reading tells us that we reveal ourselves to others each time we speak. Sad to say, we don't reveal ourselves to ourselves!

In the Gospel, Jesus asks us why we see the speck in our neighbor's eye and fail to notice the plank in our own eye. The old Greek philosopher said, "Know thyself." That's the first step toward integrity or maturity or just being a virtuous person.

Cervantes remarked that to know oneself was the most difficult lesson in the world to learn! The old Scottish poet, Robert Burns, said: "Oh wad some power the giftie gie us To see oursels as others see us!" ("O would that God some grace would give us to see ourselves as others see us.")

The point is that not too many of us really want to face ourselves honestly. We might discover that we are boring windbags, when we thought we were brilliant conversationalists. We might find that we were idle gossipers, when we thought we were conscientiously interested in others.

We might find that we are attention seekers or victims or whiners or braggarts or hypocrites or that we have a lot of bad traits. But no one wants to tell us the real truth. No one wants to tell us that we have bad breath or that we have annoying habits.

Perhaps it's best that we don't always tell the truth, for most of us really don't want to know ourselves. But Christ dares us to know ourselves truly, to face ourselves honestly. If we find ourselves wanting, he still loves us. He forgives us. He empowers us to change. He can give us strength to overcome our rough spots if only we face ourselves honestly.

Our mothers probably told us, "When you are perfect, you can correct others." Good advice! Let's know ourselves and correct ourselves. That will be a full time job; we won't have time to search for specks in others' eyes.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 8th Sunday in Ordinary time. An interesting fact about our celebration of the 8th Sunday is the fact that it is rather rare that we celebrate it. Because Easter is so late this year, these extra Sundays of Ordinary time are added to the liturgical year. Apparently, we have celebrated this 8th Sunday of Ordinary time in 2001 and 2019, so you see we do not hear the readings very often in our liturgical year.

As I read over the first reading for our Mass, I had to smile as I find this reading so realistic in human life. The book of Sirach confronts the use of speech. It says, "When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do one's faults when one speaks. The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had, so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks, for it is then that people are tested." The shortened version would be that our language reveals our character; what we speak unveils our thinking. Our language often reveals the deepest recesses of our minds and hearts, both good and bad. So if there is any warning given, our reading tells us to be careful in what we say. Perhaps as we reflect upon this reading, ask yourselves what is our language when we get angry; or how does our language reflect our frustrations. Unfortunately, when we lose control of our feelings, it is reflected in our language and that is not always the greatest.

This Wednesday, March 2, is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Our Mass schedule for this day will be the following:



This book presents the Cardinal Virtues and the Freedom to Love. Please take one per family if you are interested in using it during the season of Lent to grow as a person.

Also, rice bowls are available to our parish families to use during the season of Lent. You are invited to take one and place it on your dining table, and then as you eat to be conscious of those in the world who go to bed hungry each day. The intention is to pray for them and in whatever way possible to sacrifice some of your change each day and place it in the rice bowl. In doing so, you are creating an awareness in your family for those who are without and provide an avenue to make a sacrifice for them during the days of Lent. Your contributions will be collected after Easter.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis wrote of our need not only to care for people with disabilities but also "to ensure their 'active participation in the civil and ecclesial community" (Fratelli Tutti, no. 98).

People with disabilities in Belarus face challenges of social isolation, especially if they rely on wheelchairs. If they lack close relatives, friends, or guardians to help them, they can find it difficult to access services, information, and accessible transportation. As a result, they often lack the opportunity to build relationships, work in groups, and meet their social and spiritual needs. These challenges become even greater in times of disruption, such as the political unrest and protests surrounding the national elections in Belarus in 2020 and continuing into 2021.

The Tabita program – an initiative begun in June 2018 that is run by Caritas Belarus and supported through funding from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe – assists people with disabilities by bringing them together to socialize, share their experiences, and pray in an environment where volunteers, as well as a volunteer coordinator and a part-time social worker, are available to assess and assist participants with their physical, social, psychological, and spiritual needs.

When you support the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, you help programs like Tabita break down the walls of isolation separating people with disabilities from the community and from each other.

Please be generous to the collection, because your support helps the Church in Belarus alleviate the loneliness and isolation facing people with disabilities. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish online giving platform. #iGiveCatholicTogether also accepts funds for the collection.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

- 1. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
