FROM THE RECTOR – 5th Sunday after Epiphany

"Called through pure mercy to belong to the mystical Body of Christ, we must in our turn show mercy to our neighbor since we are made one with him in Christ Jesus. Even in the Church such unreserved charity is a difficult matter; it requires perseverance and patience, since in God's kingdom here on earth there are both good and bad, and it is only when our Lord comes to judge men ... that He will separate the one from the other for all Eternity." (St. Andrews Daily Missal) These words require attentive contemplation from us. St. Paul asserts charity above all things for it is charity that binds and holds us together. How hard it is to develop a charitable heart and to live in peace and love with one another. And yet we must strive daily to make this a reality because our deepest desire is union with the Lord. As we draw close to the season of Lent spend these weeks of Septuagesima contemplating the sacrifices you will undertake in order that you might grow in love offering to the other the mercy you have received from God.

DEPOSITIO ALLELUIA: 12 February @ 8:15 am

Farewell to the Alleluia on the Saturday before 1 Vespers of Septuagesima: The *deposition* (discontinuance) of the Alleluia on the eve of Septuagesima assumed in medieval times a solemn and emotional note of saying farewell to the beloved song. Although Pope Alexander II had ordered a very simple and somber way of 'deposing' the Alleluia, a variety of farewell customs prevailed in many countries up to the sixteenth century and beyond. They were inspired by the sentiment which Bishop William Durandus (d. 1296) voiced in his commentaries on the Divine Office: 'We part from the Alleluia as from a beloved friend, whom we embrace many times and kiss on mouth, head and hand, before we leave him.' The Oratory will offer Holy Mass on Saturday, 12 February @ 8:15 am and following Holy Mass we will bury the Alleluia at the Blessed Mother's altar. Confessions will be heard before Holy Mass @ 7:00 am. All are encouraged and invited to attend.

THE LENTEN SEASON

The season of Septuagesima begins on Sunday, 13 February 2022 and provides us with the opportunity to better prepare ourselves for our Lenten Season which begins on Ash Wednesday, 2 March 2022. In order to spiritually assist the faithful of the Oratory during the Lenten season there will be additional opportunities for both confession and the celebration of the Holy Mass.

During Lent, in addition to the times already published, <u>Confessions</u> will be heard from 11:30 am until 12:45 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays (beginning 8 March 2022).

We will also have the opportunity for <u>Eucharistic Adoration</u> on the following days and times (beginning Friday, 4 March 2022):

• Wednesday: 5:00 pm to 6:15 pm

Tuesday/Thursday: 11:00 am until 1:00 pm

• First Friday: 1:00 pm until 6:00 pm

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> will be celebrated on the Fridays of Lent after the conclusion of the 12:15 pm Holy Mass with the exception of the First Friday in March (4 March) and April (1 April).

Finally, the schedule for <u>Holy Week</u> has been determined and will allow us to celebrate the full Sacred Triduum this year. I share this information with you this early so that you might plan your schedules accordingly: HOLY THURSDAY @ 4:00 PM; GOOD FRIDAY @ 3:00 PM; HOLY SATURDAY @ 2:00 PM

All of this information will continue to be available both in our bulletin and on-line. Also, next Sunday there will be a sheet on the Oratory table in the vestibule that will have all this information for our Lenten season.
