



## Liturgy Corner

#### Why Do We Veil Statues in the Later Weeks of Lent?

We can find the instruction for this custom in the Roman Missal:

In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

While it might seem odd or maybe even counter productive to cover these glimpses into heaven during the most holy time of the year, this practice is aimed at heightening the senses of the faithful and developing anticipation for Easter. We are able to notice something different and begin in our hearts a more immediate preparation for Easter.

The point of the veil is that they are not meant to be there forever. We want the veil to be removed so that one can receive the beauty underneath.

The unveiling before the Easter Vigil ought to call to mind the veiled world that we live in – that while "we are in the world, we are not of it." Every now and then, and hopefully on a daily basis, we catch glimpses of heaven, but it is always through the view of a veil. Only in death is the veil lifted. Only in Christ's Passion is the temple veil torn in two. Only through the Cross do we have the Resurrection.


## Health & Wellness




