#### From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **Third Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear Jesus' exhortation to repent. Jesus uses the parable of the fig tree to demonstrate that He will give us every opportunity to change our ways. When we engage in true repentance we are certain to bear good fruit. If the repentance and fruit do not come, the "gardener" will return later for the "cutting."

Today our RCIA elect celebrate their **First Scrutiny.** The Church teaches that the scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance...The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect." We pray that our elect and candidates may join us throughout Lent to reflect on their own weaknesses and find healing in God's grace and mercy.

There will be **Two "City-Wide" Lenten Penance Services** for Quincy area Catholics to attend. Many priests will be available to hear confessions.

## Liturgy Corner

When Are We Supposed to Sit Back Down After Holy Communion? When Father Closes the Tabernacle? When Father Sits Down? Other?

Kneeling is a posture that fosters humility. To kneel is to put oneself in a vulnerable position before another. When we kneel before the Eucharist we are recognizing the Eucharist as a "Who" not an "it"; namely our Lord who loves us passionately and desires communion with us.

Kneeling during the Communion Rite is a recognition of Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. However, the General Instruction to the Roman Missal does not specify a moment that kneeling should conclude, stating, "if appropriate, they may sit or kneel during the period of sacred silence after Communion." Sitting is a posture of receiving. That is why we sit to be taught at the homily. The period of Sacred Silence refers to the moment after the distribution of Holy Communion has concluded (everyone has received). Exception is obviously made for those who have health conditions that legitimately prevent them from kneeling.

It is worth mentioning again that we do not kneel out of respect for the priest, or only until we have concluded our prayer; it is out of respect for Christ's Presence in the Eucharist. The argument could be made that it is proper then to kneel at least until the vessels are purified as even the smallest particle of the Eucharist contains Jesus's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Additionally, the Catechism states, "The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist." The Eucharist subsists within us for about fifteen minutes. There is a famous story about St. Philip Neri who sent two servers with lighted candles to follow a man who left Mass early after Holy Communion. The man came back and asked St. Philip why he did this and St. Philip responded, "We have to pay proper respect to Our Lord, Whom you are carrying away with you. Since you neglect to adore Him, I sent two acolytes to take your place."

We must take special care to adore our Eucharistic Lord. Prayerfully consider how you can adore Him in the postures at Mass. <u>New Live-Streamed Rosary Time – Tuesdays at 9 p.m.</u>




#### Youth Group!


