

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Lent. In the gospel we hear Jesus' Parable of the Prodigal Son. We are all quite familiar with this story of conversion of the younger son who returns to his forgiving father. It is an inspiration to all of us to know of God's overwhelming mercy. We see in the unforgiving older brother quite the opposite. Hardened by his own anger he is unable to find mercy for his younger brother. Are we harboring that same kind of anger toward others? We best imitate God when we let go of our anger and forgive.

Today our RCIA elect celebrates his **Second Scrutiny.** The Church teaches that the scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance...The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect." We pray that our elect and candidates may join us throughout Lent to reflect on their own weaknesses and find healing in God's grace and mercy.



Where Do the Songs Sung Before and After Eucharistic Adoration Come From?

Did you know the song *O Saving Victim* used at Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and *Down in Adoration Falling* used at Benediction were written by the "Angelic Doctor" himself, St. Thomas Aquinas? *Down in Adoration Falling* is taken from the last two stanzas of *Pange Lingua* by Aquinas. This is traditionally sung at the conclusion of Holy Thursday Mass. A partial indulgence is granted unto anyone who recites it and a plenary indulgence is granted unto anyone who recites it on Holy Thursday or Corpus Christi!

Eucharistic Adoration is an opportunity to spend quality time with the Lord. It is a time where you gaze upon Christ and He also gazes upon you. Think about it as date night with the bridegroom of your soul!




