From The Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **1st Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear of Jesus' forty days in the desert being tempted by Satan. Our own forty days of Lent can also be an opportunity for us to be led into the "desert" where we can focus more deliberately on our relationship with God. May these forty days be for us an opportunity for authentic renewal.

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting – giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

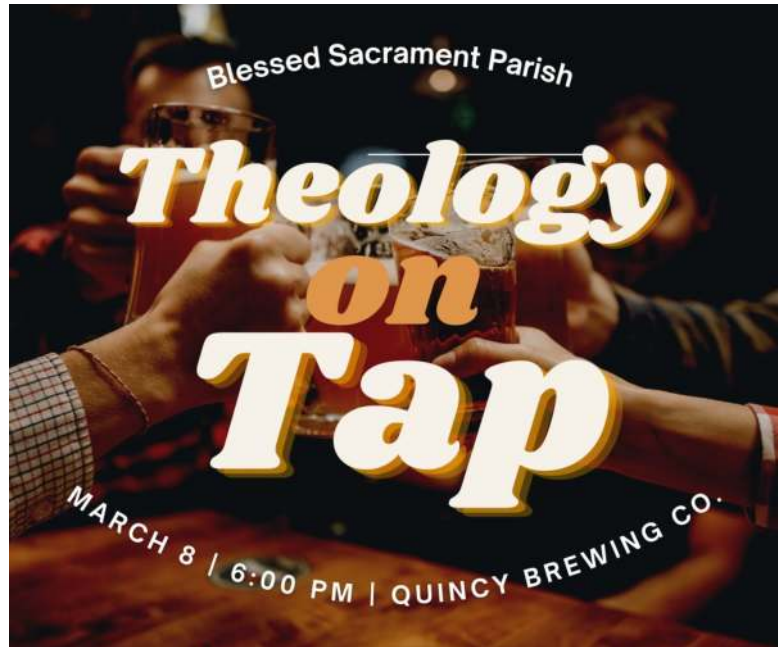

Liturgy Corner

Why do some people receive in the hand, some on the tongue, and even some on their knees?

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops states, "The communicant may choose whether to receive the Body of Christ in the hand or on the tongue. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: 'When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost.'"

The reception of the Eucharist is a personal decision about how to best receive our Lord with reverence. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, Catholics would receive at the altar rail on the tongue. This had several benefits. Firstly, communicants were able to express bodily their interior disposition: one of humility and adoration as they approached the table of the Lord. Additionally, it prevented any particles of the Eucharist from falling to the ground. Finally, it also prevented Jesus being laid into hands that were not clean.

Today, many Catholics choose to receive the Eucharist on the tongue to encourage devotion within themselves to the Eucharist and also prevent any of the Eucharist particles from being lost and potentially trampled on. Even the smallest crumb of the Eucharist is the totality of He who cannot be contained – Jesus Christ. People who receive on their knees also do this out of great love for their Eucharistic Lord.

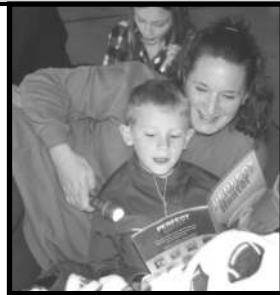
These dispositions do not communicate anything to us about the communicant, but rather about who it is that they receive.

While our physical disposition is important, our interior disposition is even more crucial. One should not receive the Eucharist if they are in a state of mortal sin without receiving absolution or have not observed the hour fast – for in doing this they drink judgment upon themselves (1 Corinthians 11:29). Common mortal sins include but are not limited to: missing Sunday Mass, sex outside of marriage, marriage outside of the Catholic Church, same-sex sexual relationships, drunkenness, pornography usage, masturbation.

This March, we will be focusing on Nutrition...

Nutrition plays a role in all persons health and wellness, and can be closely tied to a person's behavior, spiritual life, and relationships. The human body is biologically designed to function at its optimum level of fitness by ingesting the nutrients, proteins, and vitamins it needs from outside sources. The materials we ingest provide our body with energy it needs to perform basic cellular activity that makes our bodies work. While food available to us can vary by region, climate, and weather, we are blessed enough to live in a country where an immense assortment of food is abundant, and in an age when food preservation is almost effortless. Poor nutrition contributes to increased disease (especially heart disease!), shorter life-span, and lower quality of life.

Healthy Snacks: Bananas, oranges, honeydew, cantaloupe, grapes, kiwi, blueberries, strawberries, and blackberries.

Did you know that fewer than 1 in 10 adults and children consume less than the daily recommended amount of vegetables, and only 4 out of 10 children, and 1 out of 7 adults, get enough fruit daily.
