

#### Not Reinventing the Wheel

In the first reading this Sunday, God tells Moses: "I am the God of your fathers...the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." In this statement, God reminds Moses and us that we're all connected. We are the children of our ancestors. Their God is our God. Because of this, we know the One with whom we are dealing. We know how He works. We know what is true about Him and about us. For this reason, when we find ourselves up against difficulties, we can look back to the example of Moses and others to see how we should handle them...and how God will handle them as well. The Israelites found themselves sorely oppressed, so they cried out to God and God answered them, giving them a pathway to freedom. This has been the pattern throughout the history of our people, and we should not expect things to be any different now. So, when you find yourself in a bad spot, don't feel like you have to reinvent the wheel; follow the example of Moses and cry out to the Lord for help...and expect that the Lord will likewise give you a pathway out.




