March 20, 2022 — Third Sunday of Lent (C)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

We hear commentary from Jesus about the breaking news of His day: "Eighteen killed when a tower fell"; "Devout Galileans were murdered by Pilate"... these stories are little-different than the tragic stories we hear everyday on the news of crime, war, violence, political intrigue and sudden disasters. Jesus adds, "I tell you, if you do not repent, you will perish as they did!" (Luke 13:5). By this, I interpret that Jesus means their passing was "sudden" and perhaps "unprepared." These words have a fire-and-brimstone quality which is usually not associated with the "nice" Jesus who holds lambs in His arms, welcomes children in His midst, and whose words are rooted in mercy.



However, a parable follows, contrasting the patience and hopefulness of the gardener with the practicality of

the property owner. If a fig tree is not producing fruit, it simply consumes the minerals in the soil... it should be cut down! The gardener counsels patience, explaining that if properly fertilized and tended, the tree may yet bear fruit.

So it is in the ministry of Jesus where we find God's patience on display. God invests divine grace and mercy in His people that they might bear fruit. We are called to repent and that calling is indeed urgent, for failure to turn from our ways will result in our death! But God delays final punishment in the hope that we might have a different outcome!

As we get deeper into the Lenten Season, the call to conversion of mind and heart continues to grow. As DON'T BE AFRAID we recognize where we have failed in our everyday calling to be disciples and witnesses to the Risen Christ, and as we consider the resolutions pressed on our hearts by the Holy Spirit to do better in the future, the need for Sacramental Reconciliation becomes ever more urgent. During the remaining weeks of Lent, there will be opportunities to go to Confession, both at normal times as well as added times to accommodate the season. Two Sunday afternoons are being set aside where the priests of the Deanery will gather to hear confessions until all are heard.



These dates are: Sunday, March 20, 2 p.m. at St. Anthony Church, and Sunday, April 10, 2 p.m. at St. Peter Church.

Further opportunities for Sacramental Reconciliation will be made available on Saturday Afternoons before the 4 p.m. Mass (approximately 3:00 p.m. to about 3:45). This will join our regularly-scheduled time after the 4 p.m. Mass on Saturdays, running from about 5:15-6:15. For your convenience, worksheets on "How to go to Confession" with an Examination of Conscience have been printed up for the season, as they have in previous years, and are available in church.

"Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with your whole heart!" (Joel 2:12)
