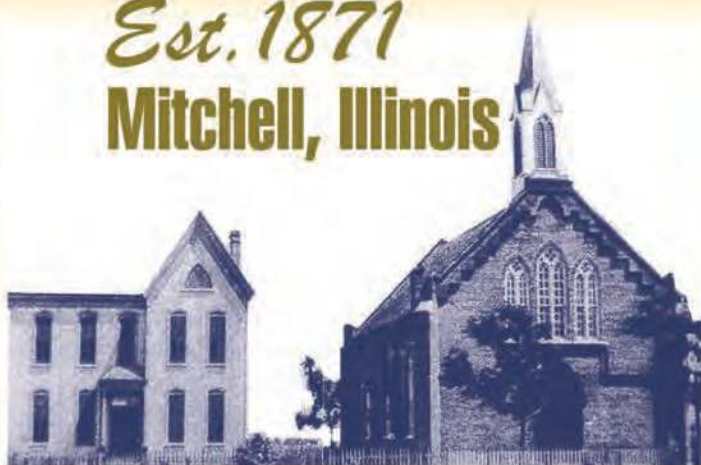
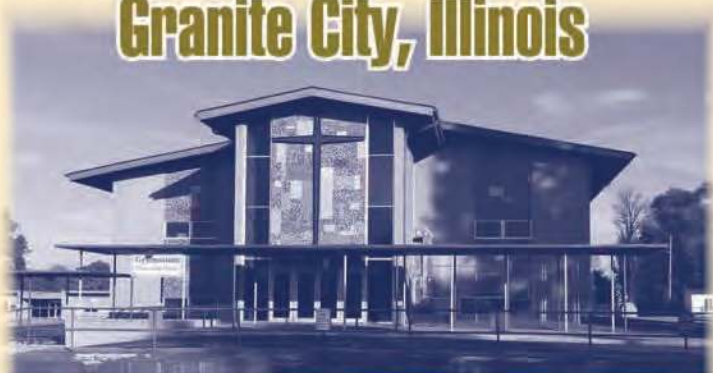

Reflecting on Seeing. Since Jesus is the light of the world (look to the Easter candle), there is no room for darkness in this Reign of God. The healing of the man blind from birth clearly illustrates this for, while sightless, he does as he is told and has insight into God's activity in life. He "sees" even before he sees.

- ◆ What will I do, at Jesus' request, to see and live the Christian life more clearly?

10+ New Catholics in 2023

Now that we're into the Scrutinies in these last weeks before our Elect come to the Easter Sacraments at the Easter Vigil, we're intensifying our prayer for Lisa, our Elect... but I'm also already envisioning next year's "class."

"I have a dream" that next year, we will have a group of *at least 10* candidates seeking entry or full reception into the Church at Easter. Seriously, the Holy Spirit continues to put it onto my heart that there's absolutely no reason that we shouldn't be able to strive for the joyful opportunity to welcome that many people into the Church.

STEP ONE: JOIN ME IN PRAYER EVERY DAY AT 10 a.m.

Join me in prayer every morning at 10 a.m. for 10 (or more) new Catholics next year. Set an alarm on your watch or phone to remind you at 10 a.m. every day. Join me in praying an Our Father every day at 10 a.m. for Our Father in Heaven to draw 10 more people to the Church through our efforts.

STEP TWO: INVITE SOME FRIENDS TO EXPLORE

You can invite anyone who has ever expressed interest in just learning more about the Church. I'm going to host a wide-open, no commitment, "Catholic 101 and Q&A" session in the Harmony Room the morning of Saturday, May 21. From 9–10:30 a.m., I'll briefly cover the basic tenets of our faith, then throw the floor open for a Q&A where we'll take any question. The goal of this day is to give friends, family, and neighbors a chance to come just learn more without any commitment to RCIA or anything further, and an option other than coming to Mass or something else of that sort.

I'd ask you to sit down in prayer and write a list of 5–10 people the Holy Spirit is encouraging you to invite to this **Catholic 101 and Q&A** session. Don't let your head block anyone from your list that comes to your heart. Then invite them. Put them in contact with me if they have any questions before they come. We'll take anyone willing to learn a bit more! Saturday, May 21, 9–10:30 a.m.

STEP THREE: INVITE SOMEONE TO A DEEPER EXPERIENCE

Bring someone interested in going deeper with you to one of our Thursday evening Learning in the Library sessions – they're geared towards any adult. Or invite their kids to Vacation Bible School at the end of July / start of August. Invite them to come pray with you at Sunday evening Holy Hour. Explore the bulletin for all the different ways you could invite them to engage a bit further before we invite them into RCIA to continue learning and exploration later this summer.

STEP FOUR: LIVE A JOYFUL LIFE. SHOW YOUR FAITH

Smile. Live the faith. Make others around you wonder what you have (the Eucharist and a community of faith) and desire to be a part of it! People will ask, and then you can repeat steps 1–3 above to start to invite them in.

I pray every day for 10+ new members exploring a closer relationship with Jesus in the Church this coming year. Pray with me, please, and enter into this mission to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19–20a)
