First Sunday of Lent MARCH 6, 2022

Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Romans 10:8-13; Luke 4:1-13

Originally, Lent was the final preparation time for baptism which (except in case of emergency) was ministered only in the Easter Vigil and only to adults. Nowadays, Lent is the time for our baptismal renewal.

By baptism, we became children of God, temples of the Holy Spirit, members of Christ's own living Body (the Church), sharers in the very life of God. By baptism, we entered into a covenant with God. We promised that we would be loyal to the Lord in every aspect of our lives. We promised to love others as Christ loves us, and to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect.

Very likely, most of us have failed to live up to our baptismal dignity and our baptismal commitment. Lent, then, is the time to renew. We began on Shrove Tuesday with a good Confession. On Ash Wednesday, we remembered that we are nothing – dust, and therefore we must not live for this world.

Today, we reflect that we, like our spiritual ancestors, are nobodies. Nevertheless, God called us to be a holy people. He brought us to the promised land of baptism. So we must return to him the first and best of our lives.

In the Gospel, we see that even Jesus was tempted. If we are loyal to Christ, we shall also be tempted. We are tempted to follow the ways of the world instead of the way of Christ. We need help. We need faith. We need renewal!

God promises that he will never permit us to be tempted beyond our strength to resist. But we must pray for faith and for grace. Let us make use of this wonderful Lenten season to be more fervent in prayer, more generous in works of charity, more eager in celebrating the mysteries of our salvation. Let us daily die to this world and to self, in order that we may rise to live in his glory.

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin this new month of March, the Church begins its new season of the liturgical year called Lent. The word "lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon "lencten," which means "spring." "Historically, Lent was the retreat-like final preparation period for catechumens, those being initiated into the Church and into the Paschal Mystery at the Easter Vigil. Naturally enough, it became in time a renewal period for the already baptized faithful, the sponsoring community being inspired by the conversion of the catechumens. It is also a time of penance for those enrolled in the order of penitents, an early form of the Sacrament of Penance, limited to serious sinners. The whole Church came to adapt Lent as a penitential season whereby the faithful initiated both catechumens and serious sinners in doing penance." (the Catholic Source Book)


This weekend we celebrate the First Sunday in this penitential season. Our gospel reading for this First Sunday is Luke's presentation of the temptations of Jesus. After His baptism, Jesus went into the desert to fast and to pray. This was the same experience that the Israelites had as they wandered in the desert being led by Moses out of Egypt. And it was in this desert that God formed and fashioned them as His people. It was also in this same desert that they were tempted in differing ways, from complaining about food, lack of water, and even fashioning an idolatrous image of God as the golden calf. Yes, the Israelites confronted their weaknesses in the desert and now we find the humanity of Jesus doing the same. It states that after forty days, Jesus was tempted. Now Jesus' temptations were different from ours, but regardless the devil seems to know what might allure us and challenges us in these areas of weakness. If one ever wants to know the weakness of your human nature, I just bid you to look at your temptations and they will reveal to us our character deficiencies. Perhaps this Lent we can use this time to do this self inventory so that we can then allow God's graces to strengthen us in these areas.

Today we also call our catechumens (those not baptized) to become part of the Elect (those in the final stages in anticipation of baptism). These catechumens will be sent to Springfield today to celebrate a special liturgy with the Bishop at the Cathedral in Springfield. Please pray for them as they enter their final preparation period for the Sacraments of Initiation.

I remind you that we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation each weeknight from 5:45–6:15 p.m. followed by the celebration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist at 6:30 p.m. Please join us in our celebration of these sacraments, Monday through Friday. These times give everyone the opportunity to celebrate these sacraments and hopefully grow in the grace of God and His Church.

I also want to congratulate the Quincy Notre Dame Lady Raiders who have reached the final four of the state tournament class 2A at Redbird Arena in Normal, Illinois. We are very proud of them and they will always be winners in our eyes. Congratulations, Coach Eric Orne and our girls.

For those parishioners who need a reminder, there are rice bowls available in the Narthex to be used during the season of Lent. These rice bowls are to be used on your dinner tables as a reminder that there are people in the world who go hungry each night. Perhaps by having a rice bowl on your table, it will remind you of the poor and for us to remember them in our prayers as well as assist them in our sacrifices during Lent. This is the almsgiving that is very much a part of our Lenten discipline. Second, we also distributed Lenten books called the *Art of Living* by Art Sri. This book is for your spiritual journey through Lent. I ask you to take one home with you and make it a point to read it in this Lenten journey.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE: A visiting preacher gave his hat to the ushers so they could pass it around for a goodwill offering. When it came back to the preacher, it was nearly empty. 
