From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent, and as we do so we are reminded that prayer opens our hearts to the life-changing power of the Risen and Glorified Lord.

One of the chief characteristics of Jesus' life is His commitment to prayer. At every key moment from baptism to death, Jesus shows Himself as a man of prayer. As disciples, we too are called to be people of prayer and so this is a good time for us to review our life of prayer.

Like all relationships, our relationship with God takes time and effort...time to talk, share our lives, and get to know Him in all His glory and life-changing power. And just as God wants us to share our needs, He also asks that we stop and listen to His Word.

With all this in mind, we read today Luke's account of the Transfiguration. At first glance, it might seem an odd selection for Lent...why not a Gospel on healing or mercy? But this is no arbitrary choice. It is chosen to encourage and strengthen us as we undertake our Lenten practices and to remind us that through them we hope to share in the glory of God, glimpsed here in Christ on the mountaintop.

Lenten practices by themselves are meaningless if they do not have this greater meaning. Indeed, the whole Lenten season is without purpose if it does not ultimately lead to the glory of Easter.

St. Luke's account of the Transfiguration follows the other synoptic Gospels...Jesus leads His disciples up the mountain to pray. Suddenly, they are witnesses to something new as the Glory of God shines through His humanity and the prophets Moses and Elijah appear in conversation with Him. These, too, were mountain men who in times of struggle sought solace in the high peaks. There they encountered God and were renewed and strengthened in their mission.

Getting a glimpse of Jesus' glory, Peter begins to panic, and as so often happens to many of us in the face of what is new and unsettling, Peter falls back onto what is familiar and less threatening. His suggestion for three tents shows how much he has yet to learn about Jesus. We, too, need to be open to that learning.

But from the cloud that covers the mountain comes the Father's voice, "This my chosen Son, listen to Him." Here is the true manifestation of God. Jesus is more than just another prophet; He is God's chosen Son. Here are words that all must hear and accept if they are to be transformed and changed.

In the darkness of our sometimes-sinful world, we need to hear these words again. We, too, must be willing to climb the mountain and to experience the Glory of God. We need to hear again the words of the Father as Jesus is revealed as the One who speaks on His behalf and is worthy of our attention and obedience.

This Lent ought to signal a transfiguration in our hearts and communities. Peter said, "It is good that we are here." As we recognize God more and more in our own life, and especially as we come together to worship, to give praise and thanks, and to receive the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, may we also know and exclaim that it is good that we are here; for it is only when we are present to the Lord that we can be open to His Word and to the glory He desires to share with us.

And now just a few notes:

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK:

- Thursday, March 17 - Optional memorial of St. Patrick, Bishop. St. Patrick was born around the year 389 of Romano-British Origin. He founded the Metropolitan See of Armagh. He is the author of *Confessio* and is thought by many to be the author of *Lorica*, a work praising Christ. He died in 461 at Down and is the patron of Nigeria and apostle and patron of Ireland. St. Patrick, Pray for us!

- Friday, March 18 - Optional memorial of St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. St. Cyril was known to be a great pastor and teacher. He was ordained bishop of Jerusalem in 348. He authored eighteen *Catecheses* and five Mystagogical Catecheses devoted to the Liturgy and the Sacraments. Exiled three times by the Arians, he died in 386. St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Pray for us!

- Saturday, March 19 - Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Joseph, of course, was the husband of Mary, our Blessed Mother and "foster-father" of Jesus. He has been honored on March 19 since the end of the Tenth Century. He was declared Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 by Pope Pius IX and Guardian of the Redeemer in 1989 by Pope John Paul II. St. Joseph is also the patron of workers, carpenters, fathers, Austria, Belgium, Bohemia, Canada, Mexico, Peru, and Vietnam. St. Joseph is mentioned in Eucharistic Prayers I-IV.

This is a significant celebration in the Church as it has been elevated to a Solemnity, the highest celebration in the Church. There is also a Feast celebrating St. Joseph the Worker on May 1 (this year May 1 will celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter as it takes precedence over a Feast).

There is tradition by many of having a St. Joseph Table on this day (March 19). I will be celebrating Mass at 8:00 a.m. that morning at Holy Family, and immediately following we will have a St. Joseph Table in the school cafeteria. Please plan to join us for Mass and the St. Joseph Table afterwards.

This is only one of two Solemnities during Lent this year that we will be celebrating (the other is the Annunciation of the Lord, which is next Friday, March 25). On this Solemnity, we will wear the color white, and the Gloria will be said (as well as the Creed). This is not

insignificant as the wearing of white and the use of the Gloria are reserved only for high celebrations in the Church during Lent.

St. Joseph is a powerful intercessor and a great example for us. I personally have a great devotion to St. Joseph. St. Joseph, pray for us!

- THANK YOU - I want to thank those who helped with and supported the St. Mary School Fish Fry. It was good to see you there.

- FISH FRY - The Mt. Sterling Knights of Columbus will be hosting a Fish Fry on Friday, March 25. Please plan to join them at the Knights of Columbus Hall in Mt. Sterling.

- ST. JOSEPH TABLE - As I mentioned above, Saturday, March 19, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Again, this is a significant celebration, and I will be celebrating Mass at 8:00 a.m. that morning at Holy Family and then we will be having a "St. Joseph Table" in the school cafeteria immediately following Mass. The St. Joseph Table is a tradition that dates to the Middle Ages, and I invite all of you to join me for Mass that day and then come over to the school cafeteria to enjoy the fruits of the St. Joseph Table (rolls, fruit, coffee, etc.). I hope that you will try to join us, and I think you will enjoy it.

- TRIVIA NIGHT - Just a reminder that the St. Mary School Trivia Night is Saturday, March 19. Don't miss out on this fun event.

- DCCW - The Spring Meeting of the Quincy Deanery Council of Catholic Women is Wednesday, March 16, at St. Mary Church in Pittsfield.

- ANNIVERSARIES - March 13 marks the anniversary of the Election of Pope Francis in 2013. March 19 is the Anniversary of the Installation of Pope Francis in 2013 as Supreme Pastor of the Universal Church. Additionally, March 19 also marks the Anniversary of the Episcopal Ordination in 2003 of Bishop Thomas John Paprocki. (Note: this is not when Bishop Paprocki was named Bishop of Springfield, but rather the date he was Ordained a Bishop.) Please keep Pope Francis and Bishop Paprocki in your prayers.

- PRIEST MEETING - The Priests of the Diocese will be gathering for their annual Spring Meeting this week on Tuesday, March 15, and Wednesday, March 16. Please keep us all in your prayers. As of the writing of this

column, I am planning to be here Wednesday morning to celebrate Mass and then leaving right away to return to the meeting. Should this need to change unexpectedly, I will try to arrange a Communion Service that morning. I plan to be back in time for the evening Confessions and Mass at Holy Family.

- AWAY FROM THE PARISHES - I will also be away from the parishes much of the day on Thursday, March 17, to attend to a personal matter. I will be leaving immediately after the 7:00 a.m. Mass and plan to return in time for the evening Confessions and Mass at St. Thomas.

Also, just a reminder, I am normally away from the office and the parishes on Mondays. If you leave me a message on Mondays, I will return it as soon as I can.

- LISTENING SESSION - As part of our diocese's response to Pope Francis' call to provide input for the Synod of Bishops that will take place at the Vatican in October of 2023, Bishop Paprocki invites all the faithful of our diocese to a diocesan wide listening session on Sunday, March 27, at 2:00 p.m. Groups will gather locally in the deaneries and connect together with the Bishop and across the deaneries by video. Please see the Catholic Times (online or in print) for more information. The Quincy deanery will gather at the St. Francis Parish Center, Quincy, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. Anyone interested from the parishes is invited.

- REMINDER - I would again like to remind you to use my cell phone number for emergencies only or matters of extreme urgency. Please use the Office/Rectorry number, 217-773-3233, for all other calls to me. You may also e-mail me at any time (akuhn@dio.org). A reminder also that, generally speaking, I do not text.

For emergencies (such as Sacramental Anointing for someone in danger of death) never ever hesitate to call me right away on my cell phone or the Rectorry phone, either one. If you call the Rectorry number for an emergency and need to leave a message, please try calling my cell phone as well.

I am happy to provide my cell phone number for use in cases of emergency. That number is published on the front of the bulletin as most of you know and, frankly, is readily accessible to nearly anyone since our bulletins are online. Still, I kindly ask that if you are sharing contact information for me

with others for a non-emergency, do not give my cell phone number.

As a side note, if you are calling to speak with Tammy, the secretary for Holy Family, our phones are not connected and so we cannot transfer calls to one another. I am happy to have Tammy return a call to you if you call me or leave a message. You can also reach Tammy by calling the school number, 217-773-2825, on school days.

- CONTACT FOR ST. THOMAS - Along the same lines, a while back I discontinued the cell phone that was being used for St. Thomas. This was the 209 number that has remained on the front of the bulletin. St. Thomas no longer has this number so please DO NOT use it. We are updating the bulletin covers to remove this number. The update can take several weeks. If you are calling St. Thomas or need to speak with Pat concerning business related to St. Thomas, please use the St. Thomas Parish number, 217-593-6685. This number currently rings at the Rectorry, and if I am unable to assist you or if you need to speak with Pat, I will take your information and have her call you when she is in the office. If you get my voicemail, please leave a message. This is the arrangement we have right now until further notice. If you use e-mail, you can also e-mail Pat regarding St. Thomas business using the St. Thomas e-mail address. Pat is the person who checks and uses that account. - STATIONS OF THE CROSS - At Holy Family, after the Wednesday evening Mass each week.

At St. Thomas, 6:00 p.m. on Friday evenings. PLEASE NOTE THE TIME. I had the time incorrect in the previous two bulletins.

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

1. ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

2. FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

3. TO DISREGARD COMPLETELY THE LAW OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE IS SERIOUSLY SINFUL.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support for me, one another, our parishes and school, and the Universal Church. Please know of my continued prayers for you.
