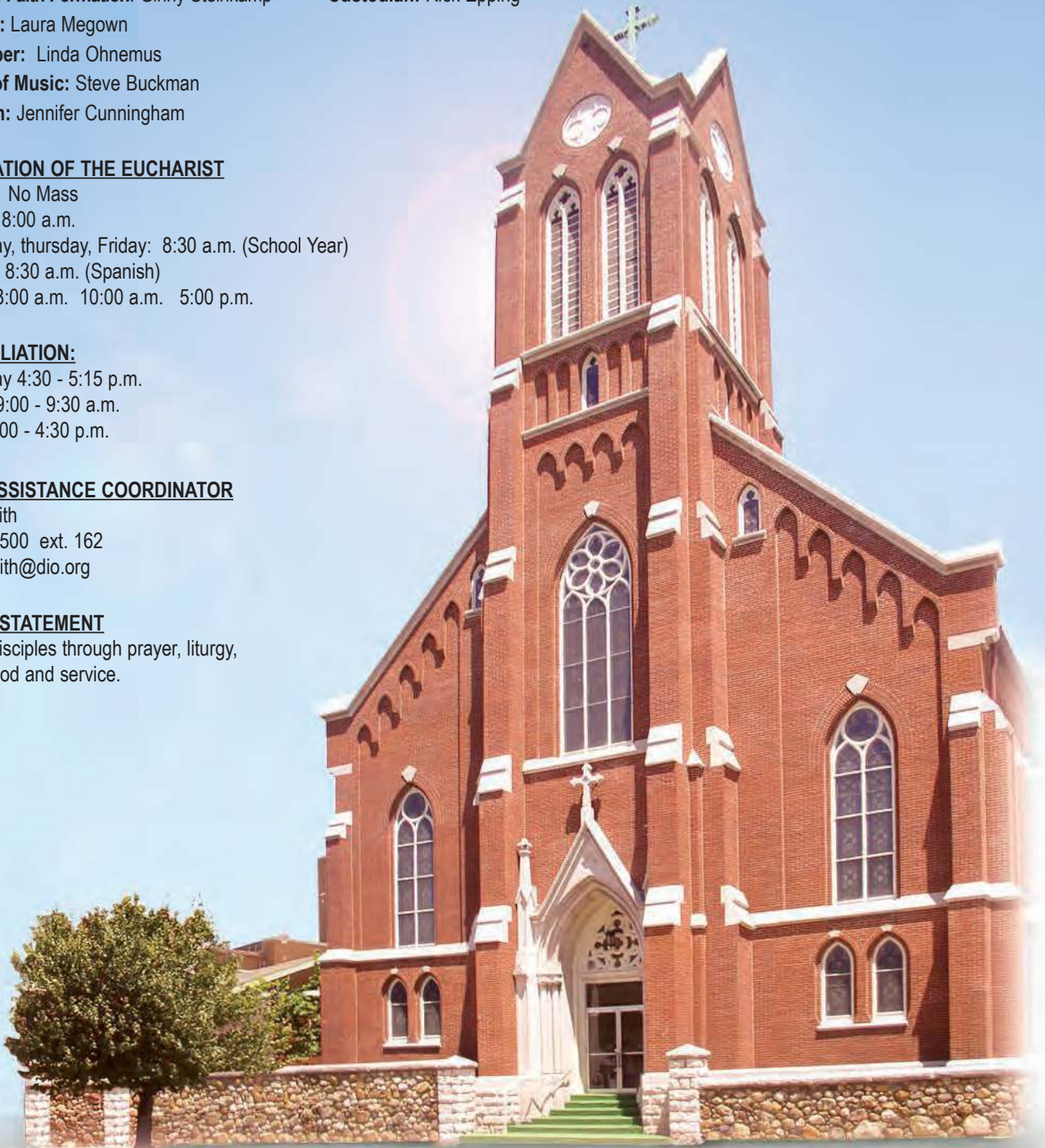

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **3rd Sunday of Easter**. We hear in the gospel the Post-Resurrection account of Seven Disciples meeting the Risen Christ while fishing on the Sea of Tiberius. After the disciples make a miraculous catch of 153 fish, Jesus takes Peter aside and asks him three times, "Do you love me?" After each of Peter's three affirmative responses, Jesus calls Peter to shepherd His people. Jesus thus commissions Peter as His first Pope. In our Easter faith we are also invited to express our love for the Risen Christ. The more we draw toward Him in love, the more Jesus invites us to serve.

This Sunday (**Sunday, May 1**) we are offering the Sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick at all Masses**. We last offered this sacrament in November, so it would be good to offer this sacrament again after six months.

With this week's arrival of May is also the Church's celebration of May Crowning. We will have our BSS May Crowning this Thursday, May 5, after the 8:30 a.m. School Mass.

From the Pastor's Desk

I encourage our families to celebrate May Crowning in your own homes by praying the Rosary together as a family. We crown Mary as queen of our Universal Church and our parish, but also as the queen of our homes and families.

On the Sunday Mornings of the **Easter season** before the 8:00 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate **Solemn Morning Prayer** in the context of a **Holy Hour of Eucharistic Exposition**. The Sunday early morning schedule will look as follows:

6:50 a.m.	Eucharistic Adoration begins
6:55-7:20 a.m.	Confessions
7:25-7:40 a.m.	Solemn Morning Prayer (Lauds)
7:40-7:50 a.m.	Benediction and Reposition
8:00 a.m.	Morning Mass

During the Easter season, Blessed Sacrament Parish will be showing a 5-session set of 1-hour liturgical videos entitled *Art of Celebrating the Mass*. Produced by the Mundelein Liturgical Institute and presented by **Fr. Dennis Gill**, these videos give an in-depth look into the theological and liturgical meaning of the Mass. We now want to make this content available to the entire parish community during this very appropriate time of the Easter Season when we especially reflect on the presence of the Risen Christ in the Eucharist. Each of the weekly videos will be shown at three different dates and times each week:

Tuesday evenings, 6:00-7:30 p.m. (GS)
Wednesday afternoons, 1:00-2:30 p.m. (GS)
Thursday evenings, 6:00-7:30 p.m. (Lower Level)

The session dates and topics are as follows:

Week 3: May 3-5:	Introductory Rites & Liturgy of the Word
Week 4: May 10-12:	Preparation of Gifts & Liturgy of the Eucharist
Week 5: May 17-19:	Communion Rite and Concluding Rites of the Mass

Liturgy Corner

What Is a "Sequence" Like the One Sung During the Easter Octave?

The use of a sequence finds its origin in medieval Catholic practices. A sequence originally served as an accompaniment to sometimes lengthy Gospel processions. The word "sequence" comes from the Latin *sequere*, meaning to follow, and was used to follow the *Alleluia* and introduce the Gospel. But modern rubrics place it before the *Alleluia*.

Before the Second Vatican Council, sequences were used for Easter, Pentecost, Corpus Christi, All Soul's Day, and Requiem Masses as a way to contextually prepare the faithful for the Gospel. In 1727, *Stabat Mater* (At the Cross Her Station Keeping) was originally a sequence added for the new feast day for the Seven Sorrows of Mary and is now used during the Stations of the Cross and in the Breviary.

Today, sequences are only required for Easter and Pentecost and recommended for Corpus Christi. The following is the first verse of the sequence that will be sung on Pentecost called *Veni Sancte Spiritus*:

*Come, thou Holy Spirit, come,
and from thy celestial home
shed a ray of light divine;
come, thou Father of the poor,
come, thou source of all our store,
come, within our hearts to shine.*

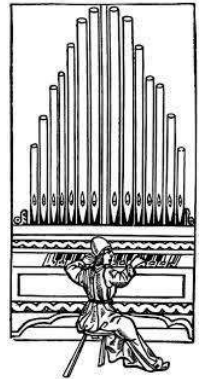

For Your Health and Wellness

May is Mental Awareness Month

Major depression is one of the most common mental disorders in the United States.

Depressive illnesses, which include Dysthymia and Major Depressive and Bipolar Disorders, affect around 9.5% of the U.S. population annually. More women are affected by depression than men.

An estimated 31.1% of U.S. adults experience any anxiety disorder at some time in their lives. A majority of people with any anxiety disorder experience mild impairment 43.5%, moderate impairment 33.7%, and a serious impairment 22.8%.

Children and teenagers have similar worries to adults, but also may have excessive worries about performance at school, family members, safety, being on time, catastrophic events, being perfect, lack of confidence, strive for approval, and avoiding school.
