

This upcoming Tuesday, April 19, at 1:15 p.m. we will hold our first official meeting of our new **Legion of Mary Presidium**. We have several active and auxiliary members who have agreed to be part of this new apostolate within Blessed Sacrament Parish. Please hold us up in your prayers as we begin.

## Liturgy Corner

### Why Are There So Many Readings at the Easter Vigil?

To keep vigil means to keep watch. At the Easter Vigil, the Church is keeping watch, awaiting Christ's coming again in glory. Additionally, we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ through the Sacraments. The USCCB says about the Easter Vigil, “It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life.”

As we keep watch, we are also remembering how God has been working out the salvation of His people since our fall in the Genesis. At the Easter Vigil, we have the potential to hear seven readings that include the stories of creation (Gn 1:1–2:2), Abraham and Isaac (Gn 22:1-18), Moses and the people's deliverance from Egypt (Ex 14:15–15:1), a reading from Isaiah about God taking the people of Israel back (Is 54:5-14), “ Thus says the LORD: All you who are thirsty, come to the water!” (Is 55:1-11), “ Hear, O Israel, the commandments of life: listen, and know prudence!” (Bar 3:9-15, 32–4:4 ), Prophecy from Ezekiel (Ez 36:16-17a, 18-28), a reading from St. Paul's Epistle to Romans, and finally Mark's Resurrection account. Each of the Old Testament readings are accompanied by a Responsorial Psalm.

These readings help the faithful to reflect on God's work throughout salvation history, and how He continues to present in our lives. We are like the unfaithful Israel who Christ came to redeem.

The Roman Missal describes the Easter Vigil as, “mother of all vigils” and “greatest and most noble of all solemnities.” This is because we celebrate the single greatest act of love ever to occur.

This study will help you enter deeper into this Eucharistic celebration and learn more about how Christ is using the ancient and beautiful Liturgy to speak to your heart. 

### WHAT IS IT?

The Legion of Mary is the largest apostolic organization of lay people in the Catholic Church, with well over 3 million active members in almost every country of the world. It has been active in the United States since 1931, has been approved by the last 6 Popes, and was endorsed by the Second Vatican Council. The main purpose of the Legion of Mary is to give glory to God through the sanctification of its members.

### WHAT DOES IT DO?

Members become instruments of the Holy Spirit through a balanced program of prayer and service. Works include door-to-door evangelization, parishioner visitation, prison ministry, visitation of the sick or aged, religious education, visiting the newly baptized, and meeting the other spiritual needs of the parish community. Legionaries are under the guidance of a spiritual director, Fr. Tom. The Legion is, in essence, an extension of the heart and hands of the pastor.

### HOW DOES IT WORK?

ACTIVE members meet once a week for prayer, planning, and discussion in a family setting. Then they do two hours of definite work each week in pairs and under the guidance of their spiritual director.

AUXILLARY members pray the Rosary and legion prayers daily. The auxiliary members are the wings of the Legion.

### HOW DO I START?

The first step is to be a guest at a meeting of the Legion of Mary. Guests are always welcome and can go on one of the work assignments with an experienced member if they choose. The Legion of Mary will have their FIRST meeting at Blessed Sacrament Church on Tuesday, April 19, from 1:15–2:45 in the Gathering Space and continue to meet each week. PLEASE JOIN US!
