



Liturgy Corner

What Is with All of the Chanting?

You may have noticed in the Lenten season more singing, specifically, chanting. For some of us, chant is relatively new. For others, maybe it is a small memory from childhood. Regardless of your experience, chanting is an opportunity to enter deeper into the text of the Mass intentionally.

Sacrosanctum Concilium, the document from the Second Vatican Council on the liturgy, explains that "the Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman Liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services." (SC, no. 116)

Here are a few benefits of chant:

- 1. Chant has really only existed within the context of the Liturgy. Praise and Worship or other forms, as wonderful as they are, could easily be found in a secular setting if the content of the lyrics were different.
- 2. Chant is text-oriented. Rather than adjusting words and phrasing to fit a melody, the text is always primary in chant. This is especially important when we are chanting Scripture (the Responsorial Psalm). We are able to have music that accentuates the text rather than the other way around.
- 3. Finally, singing is proper to the one in love. St. Augustine writes, "Only the lover sings." When we are in love, we don't just want to talk about it; we want to sing it! There is a reason some of our greatest pop songs are love ballads. When we chant the dialogues of the Mass, Jesus, the bridegroom of our souls, is able to sing to us, and we are able to respond. The way chant is written requires us to slow down and quiet ourselves. We are able to focus on God's love letter to us—Sacred Scripture.
