

#### The Passion and Perseverance

When I was in grade school (second grade maybe) our pastor told us that we could all sit during the reading of the Passion (and not just those physically unable to stand). At the time I loved it! It's the longest Gospel reading of the year, and for someone in grade school, any opportunity not to stand in one spot for a long time was a great thing. Now that I look back, I'm glad that that was the only time that I experienced that. To be sure, the reading of the Passion is LONG. However, there is so much to be learned from it: the horrors of Jesus' last days, the love that Jesus showed to those around Him, the heroism of some of His followers...and His perseverance through it all. In our small way our perseverance in reading it is a tiny way in which we can recall His suffering, and along with Him, it prepares us for the joy that is to come in the celebration of the Resurrection.
