A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Welcome to parishioners, family, friends, visitors, and all who come to worship with us on this most glorious feast of the Resurrection of the Lord! May the light of the Risen Lord shine upon you this day, and all the days of your life, that He may find you ready to enter into the splendor of His kingdom when He comes in glory.



Thank you to all who have made this celebration on Easter special – parishioners, musicians, liturgical ministers, parish staff, church decorators, sacristans. The many people who make these celebrations possible reflect the glory of the members of the Mystical Body of Christ working together to praise God the Father in union with the Holy Spirit.

I single out for **special congratulations** our new Catholics who recently celebrated the sacraments of initiation. This year two adults were received into the Church. One, Stacey Schutte, was received with her son, Zain. Both received the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Communion from the hands of Bishop Paprocki at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The other, Hunter Timsen, received Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion at the Easter Vigil this weekend. It is the sign of divine favor in a church community when it can celebrate this many baptisms and receptions at Eastertime. Please continue to invite your family members and others you know to respond to the invitation to join us as we worship God and build our Christian community.

There have been a number of inquiries into the parish office about “becoming Catholic.” While this typically happens at the Easter Vigil after a period of preparation, it can and should happen year-round. Due to the interest, we are going to start a spring/summer “Order of Christian Initiation of Adults” group with the goal of having several initiated into the Church sometime in the early-/mid-summer. If you know anyone who has been waiting... maybe this is the time! Come and join us! An informational/organizational meeting will take place on Sunday, April 24, at 12 Noon in the church.

Speaking of that community, we are diminished by the absence of those who have been baptized into the Body of Christ when they find themselves unable to join us due to sickness or old age, by past hurts at the hands of the Church or its people, or simply by the distraction by the competing goods of this world. As your pastor, I ask you to continue to help me by bringing to my attention, or the attention of our parish staff, those opportunities that will help us as a parish be more effective in our outreach and reconciliation with those who have fallen away or grown lukewarm in their faith. The work of proclaiming and living God’s mercy advances our core purpose given by the Great Commission to teach and preach to all peoples and places. We pray and work everyday to gather our parishioners and equip them to live the faith boldly by assuming their rightful place among God’s Holy People engaged in worship, study, fellowship, service, and growth.

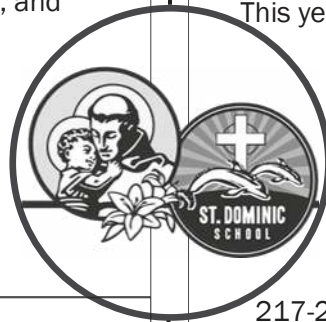
