

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The woman caught in the very act of adultery (John 8: 1-11) must have been an odd event in the life of Jesus. It would have been embarrassing for the woman and her unnamed, unmentioned accomplice. There would be a certain amount of embarrassment on the part of Jesus to be placed in a position of judgement. This is a moment where a person, caught in the act of sin, would be struck with awe...a certain sense of surprise, but also of grief of having been discovered. Not unlike the grief of the Prodigal

Son who felt the full weight of his sin and dishonor of the Father, but with the added trauma of being exposed to the criticism and taunting of the crowd and the religious authority. This is the essence of shame and the price of sin when one's conscience fears disgrace in the opinion of others.

Indeed, more is at stake than disgrace and the judgment of others... she is subject to the severest sanctions in the Law of Moses which requires women who commit adultery to pay with their lives. And so, the judgment is not only personal, but it is now also legal and capital. Defenseless, her words would have no value before a court of law.

And so, what Jesus does is equally astonishing in turning shame upon those who are gathered calling for her life. Is there one who is sinless who can throw the first stone? Apparently not. Then the one who judges turns towards her and announces that He will not condemn her either. Did she just get away with a crime? No. She is put on a sort of "parole"... "do not sin any more." We don't hear how she replies, but we can imagine that after this "close call" she would probably have taken stock of her situation and walked the "straight-and-narrow."

The work of Sacramental Reconciliation...of going to Confession... is an act of attrition on part of the faithful. We are tired of carrying our sins and the guilt of all that sin. It is also an act of contrition... it is with sorrow, not only for "the loss of heaven and the pains of hell" that we confess our sins, but that we have offended our Lord who is all-good and all-loving. When we receive absolution, we are encouraged by our own words, praying that we not be led into the "near occasion of sin," and perhaps the words of the priest to "go and sin no more" that we leave on a sort of "parole." We seal the sacrament of God's mercy with the very Blood of Christ for the forgiveness of our sins and our intention to do better. The Blood of Christ witnesses to this miracle of grace and commits us to the work of continuing conversion. It is the words of the priest in the person of Christ who makes manifest the forgiveness from God, but it is our word that binds us to the ongoing mystery of conversion, which itself is aided by grace.

Did the woman lead a sinless live after this encounter? I hope so. She had the best judge and counselor one could ever imagine. For sure, the impact of that day made a difference in her life. Can we defeat the habit of sin and gain a hatred for sin in our lives through the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Of course... just like this woman did.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be celebrated at St. Peter Church (2600 Maine) on Sunday, April 10, at 2 p.m.
