



This week I will be with the eighth grade classes from St. Dominic and St. Peter Schools as they travel to Washington, D.C. This is the first year that St. Dominic School will be participating in this annual event that has long been part of the curriculum of St. Peter School. The trips were begun by the late Fr. Roy Bauer when he was pastor in Calhoun County and then continued while he was pastor St. Peter for almost 20 years. I had the privilege of going on the trip once before in 2006. I believe that was the first year that Fr. Bauer stepped back and let Mr. Dave Cawthon take primary responsibility for planning and

carrying out the trip. Dave has taken care of the trip ever since.

A model of efficiency and frugality, the trip features an overnight bus ride tonight, Sunday, May 1, and begins first thing on Monday morning at the Ford Theater, the site of President Lincoln's assassination. Stops include the National Archives, the Holocaust Museum, the National Basilica, Arlington Cemetery, Mt. Vernon, Colonial Williamsburg, and Monticello. On the ride back, we stop at the Air Force Museum near Dayton, OH. The accommodations are spartan, the food is fast, and the hours and walking are exhausting. The stops are quick — I remember Fr. Bauer telling the kids that they have 20 minutes at the Smithsonian and that they need to use the restrooms and be ready to get back on the bus immediately at the appointed time as the driver will be using a no-parking zone to load! But a great time is had by all, and one can really see the kids mature as individuals and as a group as they see and experience our nation's capital.

Thanks to our parishioners who supported the fundraising efforts of our students for this important trip. With those efforts and the fees paid by students' families, this trip has been possible without increasing the deficit spending (yes, we are going to be underwater this year unless we have a really strong ending) for the year by the parish and school. My hope is that this can be recognized as one of the ways that by increasing our cooperation between the Catholic Schools of the Quincy area that we can provide experiences like this for all of our Catholic School students in the years ahead. I will ask our kids to pray for you, their families, their parishes, and all of their benefactors when we are at the National Basilica for Mass. We plan to be back late on Friday. In the meantime, please observe the adjustments in this week's schedule for Masses.

Here are some more details about the trip to the Holy Land that I am co-sponsoring with Fr. Tom Meyer of Blessed Sacrament Parish. The trip runs from August 24 to September 2, 2022. I have been told that there are less than 10 spaces remaining, so if you are interested, please act soon. 
Day 4, Saturday, August 27: We will start our day outside the city walls, on top of the hill of Mt. Zion where we will visit the tomb of King David. Then, the Upper Room where Jesus and His disciples had the last supper. We will have Mass at the Roman Catholic Church of St. Peter on Mt Zion. We will continue to the top of the Mountain of Olives, where we will walk the "Palm Sunday Road," then onto the chapel where Jesus wept. We will walk to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed on the night of His betrayal, then visit the Church of All Nations at the bottom of Mount Olive. We will have lunch and make our way inside the walls of the old city of Jerusalem. We will continue the Stations of the Cross inside the old city as we make our way into Jesus' crucifixion site. Throughout these Stations we will stop at multiple locations, including the Pool of Bethesda where Jesus healed the paralyzed man. Then, back to Bethlehem for dinner and overnight at Manger Square Hotel.

Day 5, Sunday, August 28: On the 5th day of the Pilgrimage to the Holy land we will continue our tour in the holy city of Jerusalem. We will start our day on the Temple Mount entering into the Holy Sepulcher church where Jesus was buried. Inside the church, we'll visit the Calvary and the holy tomb and celebrate Mass. We will then visit the Western Wall, the only remaining part of the second Jewish temple. Then we'll visit Al Aqsa Mosque and the Dome of the Rock, which was built on top of the remains of the second temple. We'll pray the Rosary at the Tomb of Mary church. We will leave the old city walls and drive to the Israel Museum, to see a live model of Jerusalem in the second temple period. We'll have a traditional lunch in Jerusalem, and then head to a Palestinian-expelled village in west Jerusalem called Lefta, in which we'll learn more history about the war of 1948 when Israel was created. Finally, we will head back to Bethlehem for dinner and overnight.
