Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday)

APRIL 10, 2022

Gospel of Palms: Luke 19:28-40.
Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11;
Luke 22:14—23:56 or Luke 23:1-49

Holy Week is the great week of spiritual renewal. Today we begin our celebration of the “Paschal Mystery.” “Paschal” means “Passover;” it also means “Easter.” The “Paschal Mystery” is the mystery of sorrow and joy, of defeat and of victory. It is the strange paradox that we must deny ourselves if we are to find ourselves – that we must die in order to really live, that we must suffer in order to share in ultimate victory.

Jesus said, “Unless a seed falls into the ground and dies, it shall not live.” He said, “He who would save his life will lose it.” He said, “He who humbles himself will be exalted.” These and other paradoxical statements are expressions of the “Paschal Mystery.”

Jesus dedicates himself totally to the will of the Father. In doing this, he encounters suffering and death. Through his obedience and humility in his suffering and death, he gains the victory of the resurrection.

It is the same with us: We must deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow him in every aspect of our lives if we are to find real life. This week’s liturgies will be filled with the paradox of the Paschal Mystery: Defeat and Victory will be intertwined, often in the same celebration.

Today, we wave palm branches of acclamation and victory; the liturgical color is festive red instead of Lenten violet. Yet the Scripture readings are of the Suffering Servant, the Son who emptied himself and became obedient unto death, and the Gospel of the Passion according to St. Luke.

Don’t let anything interfere with your spiritual renewal this week. All shopping and activity should be completed before Good Friday. The time from Holy Thursday evening until the Easter Vigil should be a time of quiet and reflection with no games or parties or entertainments. Be sure to share in the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday; do this even if you have done nothing else during Lent.

Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we begin the most solemn week of our Church year, namely Holy Week. As we enter into this Holy Week, the Church begins our Palm Sunday liturgy with the following:

My brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of Our Lord's Paschal Mystery; that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that He entered His own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in His footsteps, so that, being made by His grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in His Resurrection and in His life."

During Holy Week, we will have Masses at the following times: Monday and Tuesday, April 11 and 12, daily Mass will be at 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.; Wednesday, April 13, daily Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. We will also be celebrating Confession on each of these evenings from 5:45 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. There will be NO EUCHARIST on Holy Thursday morning.

Our liturgical celebrations for the Triduum will be as follows:

Holy Thursday, April 14, the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper – 7:00 p.m. After this liturgy, it is customary to watch and pray at the altar of reposition as the apostles were invited to watch and pray with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. In order to have people available for all three hours, we suggest the following parishioners come and be present at times designated by the letter of their last names.

From the end of the celebration to 9:00 p.m., R–Z along with our Saints Alive group; from 9:00–10:00 p.m., A–I, along with our Found group; and then finally from 10:00–11:00 p.m., J–Q along with any college or high school students. These are only suggestions as people can come and go whenever they are able to be present. Confessions on Holy Thursday will be from 3:00–5:00 p.m.

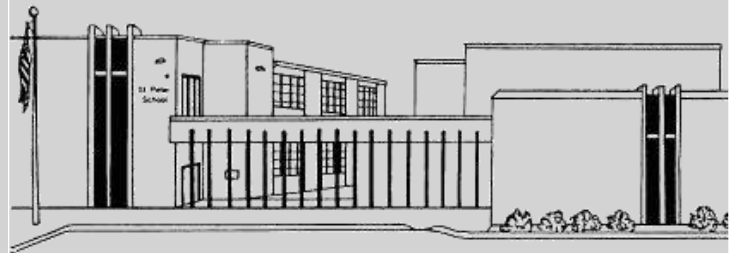
Good Friday, April 15, the celebration of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion, also at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be 11:00 to Noon and 3:00–5:00 p.m.

Then Holy Saturday, April 16, the Easter Vigil – 8:00 p.m. Confessions will be 11:00 to Noon and 3:00–5:00 p.m.

Easter Sunday, April 17, Masses will be at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

Finally, we will be celebrating the city wide Reconciliation Service at 2:00 p.m. on Palm Sunday, April 10. There will be a number of priests from Quincy who will be available for individual Confessions. Please come and join us as we truly celebrate the mercy and forgiveness of our God.

Fr. Leo's column continued..

This Tuesday, April 12, Bishop Paprocki will be celebrating the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral in Springfield at 6:30 p.m. During this liturgy, the Bishop will bless and/or consecrate the following oils to be used throughout the celebrations in our diocese: Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Catechumens. Each parish will be receiving a package of these oils to be used in their parish. Also, at the same Chrism Mass, the priests of the diocese will renew their priestly communion with their bishop.

Just a point of trivia – Funeral Masses are not allowed on Holy Thursday or during the Paschal Triduum (Good Friday and Holy Saturday). Funeral rites on these days make use of a Liturgy of the Word, closing with the rites of Farewell. The Paschal fast is observed on Good Friday and continues, where possible, until the Easter Vigil itself.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE: During Holy Week, a first grade teacher at the local Lutheran school took great pains to explain all the events in Jesus' life that led up to the first Easter. She told them about Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and finally Easter.

When she thought she had explained everything there was to know about that special week, the teacher asked if the students had any questions. One curious little boy raised his hand and asked, "What happens if you don't want to be holy all week?"

Our Lord has written the promise of the resurrection, not in books alone but in every leaf of springtime.

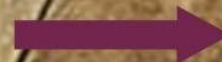
