### Fifth Sunday of Lent **APRIL 3, 2022**

Isaiah 43:16-21; Philippians 3:8-14; John 8:1-11

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

During the last two weeks of Lent, we reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus. In ancient times, crosses were very ornate and beautiful; usually the crosses did not display the body of Christ. The empty cross was a symbol of Christ's victory in the resurrection.

For this reason, the Church veiled the crosses during the time when we meditate on the suffering and death of the Lord. This was also the reason for veiling the statues: At this time, we do not think of the saints: we think of the Passion and Death of the

Today's Mass, however, looks to the effect of Christ's Passion rather than to the suffering itself. By his Passion, the Lord atoned for all our sins! He redeemed us and brought us forgiveness.

The setting of the first reading is the return of the Jews from Babylonian Captivity in 538 B.C. Deutero-Isaiah compares this release to the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Then the Lord brought them through the waters of the Red Sea to the Promised Land. Isaiah speaks of the waters in the desert and rivers in the wasteland. We naturally think of the waters of baptism in which we were baptized and liberated from sin.

In the second reading, St. Paul tells us of our new value system: In Christ, we now think of everything else as garbage. Compared with the glory of salvation, all other things are worthless. We are willing to share the suffering of Christ in order that we shall also share the glory of his resurrection.

The Gospel is the story of the woman caught in the act of adultery. The Torah called for her execution. Jesus' reply to the Scribes and Pharisees should be our motto: "Let the person without sin cast the first stone!" Although she did not deserve it, the Lord gently and respectfully forgives her and sends her on her way, telling her to sin no more.

Let us rejoice in the effect of Christ's suffering: our forgiveness! The Lord has done great things for us; let us be glad - and

### Dear Parishioners,

After a long struggle with all differing kinds of weather, we have finally reached the month of April, hoping that this particular month will bring with it warmer weather, greener grass, new growth on the trees, and the sound of some beautiful songbirds in the area. As I anticipate this change, I can also imagine more pollen in the area and a lot of allergies erupting in the lives of so many of us. But at this point in time, I will take it after such a long struggle with the change of weather that we have all been experiencing the past month.

This weekend, we celebrate the 5th Sunday in our season of Lent. This is the last weekend for our scrutinies which we will be celebrating at the 9:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday morning. Because of the scrutinies, we will be using cycle A readings for this Mass. And so the Church wants the Elect to concentrate their focus on the Paschal Mystery, especially the resurrection of Jesus. We are only two weeks from Easter and so we have two readings that speak of new life. The first reading is from Ezekiel which states: "You shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and have you rise from them." And then our gospel for this Mass is the beautiful story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Here we hear Jesus state the following as He confronts the tomb of His friend: "Lazarus, come out!" And with those words, Lazarus comes out of the tomb, a symbol of the resurrection. However, Lazarus will have to die again. What our Scriptures are trying to reassure us is that the new life given to us in and through our baptisms will have us rise to the joy of eternal life. And that new life begins today as we prepare the Elect for baptisms and as we prepare ourselves for the renewal of our own baptismal promises.

Those who attend the other Masses will hear a different set of readings. In the gospel proclaimed at these Masses, we hear of the crowds bringing to Jesus a woman caught in adultery. They force her to stand before them, ready to throw stones to kill her. This is when Jesus intervenes and states to those in attendance, "The person without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." After some reflection, they all seem to leave without throwing any stone. That's when we see the God made incarnate in Jesus as He looks up and says, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you? Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more." If we ever in life doubt whether God can forgive us of our sins, we need to remember this story. God's mercy and forgiveness is always present if and only we turn to Him seeking it. To help us celebrate that forgiveness, St. Peter Church will be hosting the city wide Penance Service this next Sunday, April 10, at 2:00 p.m. There will be a number of priests present for individual confession. Please come and join us for this celebration. Also, there will be opportunities provided for individual confession during Holy Week. These times are the following: Thursday, April 14, 3:00-5:00 p.m.; Friday, April 15, 11:00 a.m to Noon and 3:00-5:00 p.m.; Saturday, April 16, 11:00-Noon and 3:00-5:00 p.m. Plenty of opportunity to receive the forgiveness and mercy of God and hear Jesus say to each of us, "Neither do I condemn you, Go and sin nor more."
