

This week's "Question to Reflect On" is: What was the hardest change you've gone through in your faith?

What Greater Gift Can You Give? When someone passes away, extend them a plenary indulgence. It is so easy. If you received Communion daily, went to Confession monthly, and fulfilled the conditions stated below, you could release a soul to heaven everyday of your life. There is an army of souls in purgatory ready to help you. If you help them, they are especially anxious to help you. They cannot help themselves. Those who are released by your prayers and sacrifices are indebted to you and full of gratitude. They will be your prayer partners forever.

Conditions for a Plenary Indulgence:

Be in the state of grace. Receive Communion each time a plenary indulgence is sought. Go to Confession within 20 days before or after doing the prescribed work. Have a disposition of Catholicism detachment of sin, even venial sin. Pray for the intentions of the Pope, preferably one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary." Have at least a general intention to gain a plenary indulgence. Fulfill one of the following:

- At least a 1/2 hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Family or group Rosary
- Private Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament
- At least a 1/2 hour of pious reading of Sacred Scripture
- Walking the Stations of the Cross in a church or with properly erected display of the Stations
