

First Communions...and Failures

This Sunday we're celebrating First Communions at Sts. Peter and Paul – a great annual event! Unfortunately, as many of you realize, we're not celebrating them anywhere else...yet. The line that I've been saying - and you've been hearing - is still true: I'm/We're working on it. Honestly, I was hopeful that we would be in a better place organizationally than we currently are ... and that a firmer plan for the future of faith formation (outside of the school) would be in place, but we're not there yet. So, that's a failure, and believe me, I'm aware of it. Our other parishes will prepare and celebrate the Sacraments, but for now, in the midst of failure to do so yet, I will repeat for you the important options for faith formation in the home:

Go to Mass as a family, pray in the home, and utilize our parishes' subscription on formed.org. (Honestly, I expect that Formed will be a big part of the way in which the Sacramental prep will happen. So, if you're not on it yet, get on our parishes' website and follow the link!) Home is where faith formation begins, and even if the parishes aren't in a place to do Sacramental prep (yet), good work can be done in the home. And after all, that's where the most successful faith formation takes place.
