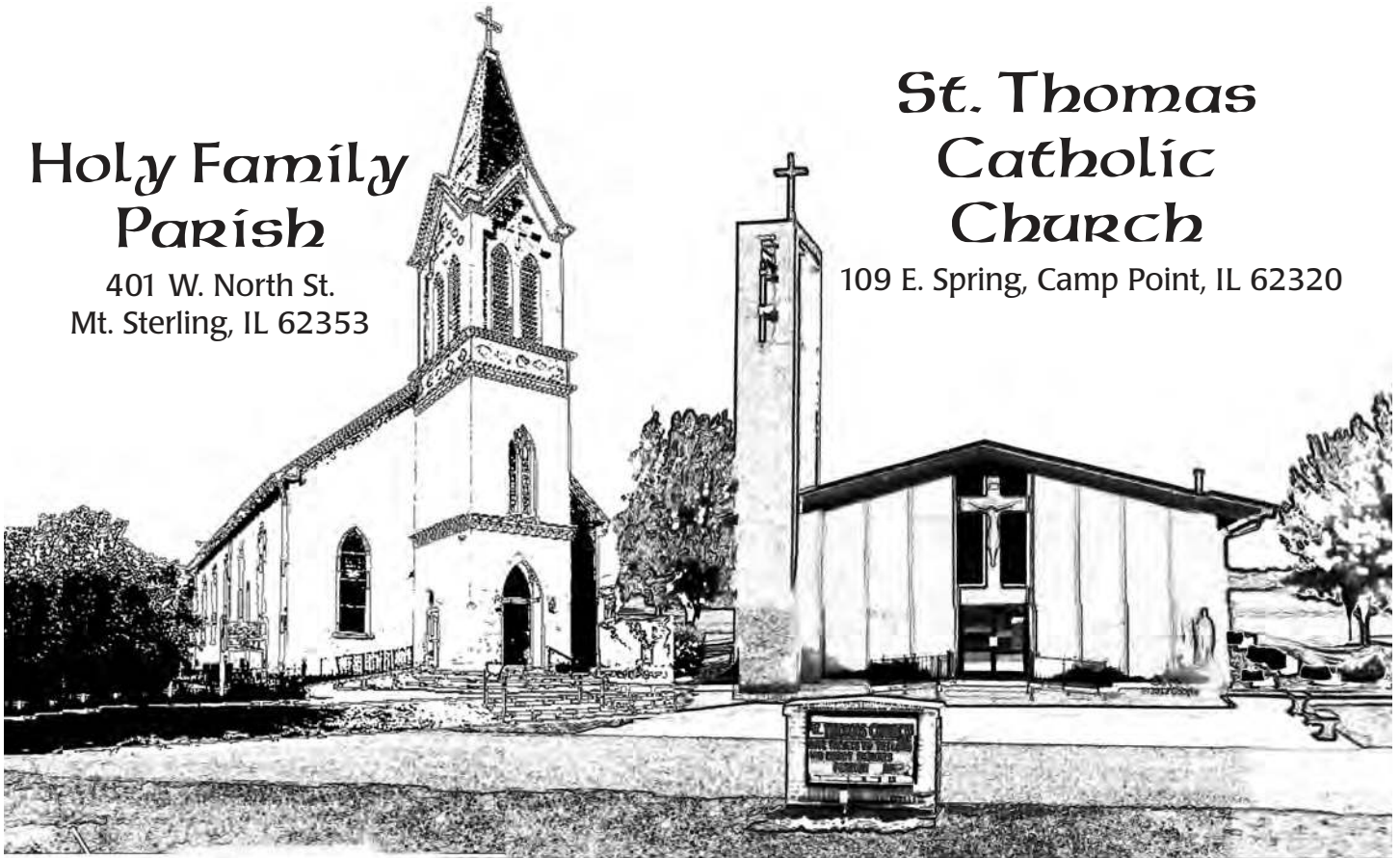

From the Pastor’s Desk

Do not let your hearts be troubled. We are not alone in our mission to the world. As we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter, our readings today give us this reminder.

Many of us at some point have probably wished, in moments of indecision, that God would just send us a clear sign about what we are called to do at that moment. (Actually, God has probably made it very clear to us, but we have failed to listen. He always gives us what we need when we need it.) Still, at times like these, when we’re surrounded by turmoil and violence, it can be easy to feel that God has left us alone to fend for ourselves; that we are somehow left on our own with no clear direction.

But the readings today reassure us. We are not alone. We have God, the Church, and the people around us to give us guidance and support when we need it. We have to be open to the different ways the Holy Spirit operates in our daily lives.

In the first reading, we see the early Church helping folks (and us) understand what is required of us. The earliest Gentile disciples in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia were misled into believing they had to follow the ancient Mosaic law if they were to be saved, if they were to be Christians. But the Apostles, guided by the Holy Spirit in their discussions, realized that Gentile believers were not called to the same strict code of law that the Jewish people had been. Thus, they sent missionaries, so to speak, to encourage the Gentiles and to help them understand.

Sometimes, as in this case, the Holy Spirit speaks to us through the word of those around us, the faithful people who listen to the voice of the Spirit and help us to understand. Jesus assures us in the Gospel that the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, will be with us if we stay close to God; if

we listen to God's Word and allow God to make His dwelling in us.

Even though Jesus is not physically with us in His human form, His Spirit is with us to guide us to the Truth, to remind us of the words that Jesus spoke to the Apostles and continues to speak to us through Sacred Scripture.

The Holy Spirit who dwells in us speaks to us in our heart, during our prayer and when we are open to receiving His message. We might wonder at times how we know that the Holy Spirit is speaking to us? One way is to stay close to God through daily prayer, Scripture reading, and the Sacraments.

One special type of prayer involves looking over our day, each evening. It is called the nightly Examen where we review the day and see how God has been working in that day; where we received special blessings, where we were effective in our discipleship, and where we might have failed. Through the daily practice of examining our lives, we begin to see more easily how God is speaking to us, for example, through prayer or through the words or action of a family member or colleague.

In just a couple weeks we will be celebrating Pentecost, the descending of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and Mary. As we prepare for this glorious celebration, let us always remember that the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, longs to speak God's Word to us and to guide us. If we're open to it, we will recognize it.

And now just a few notes:

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK:

- Wednesday, May 25 - Optional memorials of St. Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church, St. Gregory VII, Pope, and St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi, Virgin.

St. Bede, of the Order of St. Benedict, known as the "Father of English History," wrote Scriptural expositions, commentaries, and homilies. He was called "venerable"

while still living. He died in 735. St. Bede the Venerable, Pray for us!

St. Gregory VII, also of the Order of St. Benedict, championed reform of the clergy against simony, clerical marriage, and lay investiture, leading to the excommunication of Henry IV. He is also known for expanding the authority of the Holy See. St. Gregory VII died in 1085. St. Gregory VII, Pray for us!

St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi was a Carmelite mystic of Florence who led a hidden life of prayer and self-denial, praying particularly for the renewal of the Church and encouraging her fellow sisters in holiness. She was also instrumental in the reform of her order. She died in 1607. St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi, Pray for us!

- Thursday, May 26 - Obligatory Memorial of St. Philip Neri, Priest. St. Philip Neri founded the Congregation of Priests of the Oratory (C.O.), which numbers about 550 members today. Its purpose is to promote holiness of priestly life and to foster effective preaching. Noted for his joyful and simple spirit and his use of short, wise maxims, St. Philip Neri was known as the "Apostle of Rome" and "Reformer of the Eternal City." He died in 1595. St. Philip Neri has special significance to me as I will share a bit later on. St. Philip Neri, Pray for us!

- Friday, May 27 - Optional memorial of St. Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop. St. Augustine was a monk of Mt. Coelius in Rome and was sent with forty other monks by Pope Gregory I to England. He was ordained a bishop in 597 and established the Sees of Canterbury, London, and Rochester. In 601, he received the pallium as Primate of England. He died in the year 604 or 605. St. Augustine of Canterbury, Pray for us!

- ASCENSION - For us "old-timers," we are used to "Ascension Thursday" which would normally be celebrated this coming Thursday. However, in most Dioceses in the United States including the Dioceses of

Springfield in Illinois, the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred to the following Sunday. Thus, next Sunday, May 29, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord.

- DAY OF PRAYER - In May 2007, Pope Benedict XVI asked that May 24 be observed as a Day of Prayer for the Church in China. This day was chosen as it is the traditional Feast of Our Lady, Help of Christians, venerated at the Shrine of Sheshan in Shanghai. And so, on this day, I ask you to pray in a special way for the Church in China.

- PRIESTLY ORDINATION - Saturday, May 28, Bishop Paprocki will ordain two men to the Sacred Order of Priesthood at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. The Ordination Mass begins at 10:00 a.m. This is quite a joyous celebration for the Church and especially for our Diocese. I plan to be there to concelebrate the Mass. If you have never been to a Priestly Ordination, I would encourage you to go sometime. Please keep the two men being ordained for our Diocese in your prayers as well as all those being ordained in the weeks to come. The men being ordained for our Diocese are Deacon Zach Samples and Deacon Paul Lesupati.

- ANNIVERSARY - Thursday, May 26, marks the Fourth Anniversary of my Sacred Ordination to Priesthood. Sometimes it is hard for me to believe that it has already been four years, and at other times it seems like it's been years. The Priesthood of Jesus Christ that I have been called to participate in has filled me with great joy. I am so very grateful to be the Pastor here at Holy Family and St. Thomas. I am also very grateful for the many people who have supported me and my Vocation to the Priesthood, and for the countless people who have helped to form me and continue to do so.

I am especially grateful to my family, and especially my parents. They indeed

were the first teachers of the faith for me (and my siblings) and gently supported and nurtured my vocation, sometimes in the most subtle ways. The beautiful lives they lived and the sacrifices they made, all with Christ at the center, is a great example and model for me. I am very happy to offer Mass that morning for Mom and Dad. As I pray for them, I ask also that they pray for me and each one of us.

I ask each of you also for your continued prayers. Please also keep all priests in your prayers as many of them celebrate anniversaries this month. Additionally, continue to pray for good and holy vocations.

As I mentioned before, I was ordained on the Memorial of St. Philip Neri, and thus the significance of this saint in my own life and in my Priesthood. St. Philip Neri was known for his humor and his joy, and I pray that I may always share in that joy of the Priesthood with St. Philip Neri.

- LIFE - Once again, I urge you to continue to pray for the protection of and respect for all human life in all stages from conception through natural death. With continued threats, attacks, and violence against life, we must continue our efforts against the culture of death and work tirelessly to restore a culture of life.

- SCHOOL - School has either come to an end for the school year or soon will be. Wednesday, May 18, was the last day of school at St. Mary. We pray for all our students, teachers, and staff as they enter into the summer break.

- VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL - Just this week, Alicia Schmidt contacted me to offer her leadership for Vacation Bible School at St. Thomas this summer. I appreciate her reaching out and taking this on. She will be looking for some help, and I encourage you to either contact her if you'd like to help or be ready to say yes when she asks.

I would like to thank Kailyn Mast who took on the leadership role for Vacation Bible School at St. Thomas for the past few

years. As she steps away from that role, I am grateful for the work she did.

Thank you for your continued prayers for me, one another, our parishes and school, and the Universal Church. Please be assured of my continued prayers for each one of you. May you have a most blessed week.

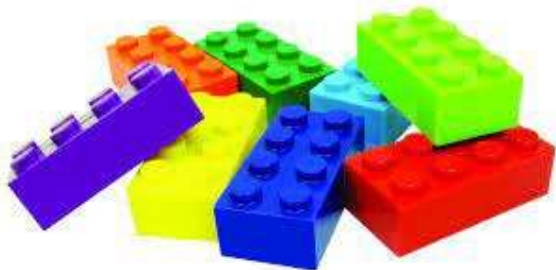
