May 29, 2022 The Ascension of the Lord

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Alleluia Alleluia

Hail the Day that sees Him Rise! This weekend in the Provence of Chicago, we celebrate the Ascension on this Seventh Sunday of Easter. The Ascension is not an ethereal exercise of doctrine sourced from a shared mystical experience on part of the disciples, lacking meaning or importance in our contemporary experience of faith. The prayers of this Mass remind us of the immanent importance of this mystery in the life of Christ to us today: where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope (collect), and he ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state, but that we, his members, might be confident in following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before (preface). The feast bids us to look forward to the final glorification of humanity — that those who follow Christ in his Death and Resurrection may know that the final destiny of the human person lies in the glory of heaven. We also are reminded that, despite going to heaven to sit at the right hand of God the Father, our Lord's promise to remain with us ushers in a new "sacramental economy" entrusted to the Church from age to age. Only a few people could witness Jesus in his human body as he preached and taught and healed and traveled across the small parcel of land he inhabited for the thirty-three years as he lived among us. But now, we encounter his True Body and Blood in our own time and place through the mystery of the Eucharist. We need not travel half-way across the world in order to encounter the one who, himself, baptizes and heals, forgives and makes holy. Through the



presence of the Holy Spirit who continues to reveal God the Father and God the Son in the Body of the Church, we are not "unlucky" for having been born in these later days. We can know God through the revelation of Scripture and the Sacred Tradition of the Apostolic Witness.

Memorial Day: Monday, May 30, there will be no regular Mass at St. Anthony Church. All are invited to attend Mass at Calvary Cemetery (1730 N. 18th Street) at 9:00 a.m. In the event of inclement weather, Mass will be moved to Blessed Sacrament Church. We remember those who have given their lives for our nation, and we call to mind all of those who have died and rest in Christ in anticipation of the Resurrection.

St. Dominic Junefest 2022: Next weekend on June 4, we celebrate our annual Junefest picnic at St. Dominic School. Festivities will begin with Mass at St. Dominic at 4:00 p.m. There will be no Saturday night Mass (4:00 or 6:30 p.m.) at St. Anthony. As we have done in recent years, as a favor to all of our Junefest workers (and anyone else who wants to come), there will be a 6:30 p.m. Mass at St. Anthony on Sunday, June 5. Thank you for your support of this important parish celebration!

School's out! Congratulations to our students and their families, as well as the Staff of St. Dominic School, as they finished the 2021-22 academic year this last week. We pray for the safety and continued intellectual and spiritual development of our entire School Family during this special time of the year. The halls may be quiet while the classrooms await their new students, but the learning does not stop. Vacations, work and chores, visits to the library to discover books and reading... all of these activities enrich our young people day by day and prepare them for more learning in the fall. Don't forget their spiritual development with Mass each weekend and prayer in the home. These practices don't need to be fancy, but they do need to be there. While

Summer is a time for our young people to recharge and experience the world in new ways that the classroom cannot contain. Experts observe that educational achievement regresses when reading and other learning activities do not take place during a long summer hiatus. In the same way, our Christian faith is diminished when it is set aside and not exercised by regular prayer and worship. Encourage your children and grandchildren to keep up with the good habits they have learned in school, that they may be life-long learners about the wonders of the world and their Christian faith.


