Fifth Sunday of Easter MAY 15, 2022

Acts 14:21-27; Revelation 21:1-5a; John 13:31-33a,34-35

Times change. Personnel come and go. We pass from one phase of life to another. This weekend, many will graduate from college; they will then go on to something new in life. This summer, many priests will receive changes of assignment; both priests and people must adjust.

Today's first reading describes a change in the Churches of Asia Minor. Paul is going to leave; they probably won't see him again. He ordains priests there, and commends them to God's care.

We can't hang on to the old forever. Parents must let go of their children. Teachers must let go of their students. We must all have faith and hope that God will always be with us.

The second reading tells of another change: John sees a new heaven and a new earth. The old had passed away. There might be nostalgia for the old and the comfortable, but the new will be better. We of the older generation must trust that the younger generation will have wisdom and insight and divine guidance as they face a new world.

The Gospel selection is Jesus' last instructions to his disciples. The big change would happen soon: He would return to his Father through his death, resurrection, and ascension. Before he leaves, he gives us a new commandment. The new commandment is the moral imperative of every Christian. We are called to love each other as Christ Jesus has loved us!

With the power of God's spirit, let us always strive to do this. Then each day will be new and vibrant. Then we shall have peace of soul even in crisis and adversity. Then we shall see that God is with us, and that all will be well.


Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, the Church continues its celebration of the Easter mystery as it celebrates the Fifth Sunday in our Easter season. In our first reading for this Easter Sunday, the Acts of the Apostles relate how Paul and Barnabas proclaimed the Good News and was spreading the faith. The apostolic Church could not keep the message of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection to itself. It was compelled to spread the message and Paul and Barnabas did just that. What surprised them was the refusal of the Jewish people to accept their message and the willingness of the Gentiles, the non-Jewish people, to embrace their message. And so we find the early Church growing and growing. And in this reading we find Paul and Barnabas making a considerable number of disciples. Today we find them challenging the early Church to persevere in the faith, especially with the words, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." It means basically that we can expect suffering for the sake of the gospel. Paul and Barnabas knew that well as their lives reflected this suffering in so many ways. Then this same reading tells us that Paul and Barnabas knew that their mission was not by themselves but depended upon the early Church. So it says that they appointed "elders" for them in each church as they continued their travels and their proclamation throughout other areas. Now the word "elder" translates the Greek word "presbyteros." In the New Testament context, this "presbyteros" is always used for the word "priest." So according to this reading, Paul ordained priests in each of the churches he established to continue the Eucharistic sacrifice and the preaching of the gospel.

This is an important term for the Church continues to ordain men to the priesthood. In fact, on May 28, Bishop Paprocki will be ordaining two young men for the priesthood in the local diocese of the Church of Springfield in Illinois. One of these young men, Deacon Zach Samples, will be sent to St. Peter Church to share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ, offering the Eucharistic sacrifice and preaching the gospel. I ask you to keep him in prayer and continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood. We need more men to consider the call of Jesus to serve in His priesthood in our diocese. As Paul and Barnabas saw the need to ordain and continue their mission, so our Bishop, priests, and parishioners should always see the same need and pray that more young people would respond to the call of Jesus in their lives.

On behalf of our parishioners of St. Peter, I want to congratulate the class of 2022 from Quincy Notre Dame who will be graduating this Sunday afternoon, May 15, at the QND gym. We are so proud of them and their many achievements and successes. Many of these young men and women were graduates of St. Peter School and so we take extra pride in each of them. Perhaps my prayer for them is that they remain ever faithful to their Catholic faith and live the words of Jesus to them in our gospel for today, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Congratulations, and our prayers, love, and support are with you.






