Fourth Sunday of Easter MAY 8, 2022

Acts 13:14,43-52; Revelation 7:9,14b-17; John 10:27-30

The Fourth Sunday of the Easter season is usually called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Read the entire tenth chapter of John for a fuller explanation of the Good Shepherd.

In the ancient Middle East, the king was often called the shepherd of his people. But for the Hebrews, only God could be the true shepherd, as Psalm 23 says. We are not sheep of an earthly monarch, but of the Lord himself. We must always follow God rather than people.

In John 10, Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd; thus he identifies himself as the Lord. He feeds us and protects us and leads us. But he does more: He lays down his life for his sheep.

The second reading alludes to the fact that the Good Shepherd has laid down his life for his sheep. In the Middle East, sheep were usually kept for wool and for milk, and not for meat.

Shepherds became very attached to their sheep; they gave them names (as we name our pets). The sheep would follow only the voice of their own shepherd (just as our pets usually respond only to our voice).

The word "pastor" means "shepherd." Let us pray that many young men of this parish may respond to the call of the Good Shepherd to share in the ministry of shepherding the flock of Christ.

Dear Parishioners,


This weekend the Church is celebrating the 4th Sunday of Easter. From our gospel reading for our Mass, we can easily call this Sunday "Good Shepherd Sunday." In this very short gospel, Jesus states, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." Of all the metaphors that describe how Jesus relates to us, perhaps this metaphor of the Good Shepherd is one of the best. It was used in the Old Testament to help people relate from their experiences of shepherds and sheep how God related to His people. Jesus continues to emphasize this same metaphor as it reflects Jesus' care, protection, and love for His followers, the sheep of His flock.

If one would look back on the role of shepherds in Israel, they were the ones who provided for all the needs of the sheep — namely, protection from wild animals, food, fresh pasture, and water. Sheep were more like pets, each being named, and each knowing full well the voice of the shepherd. The shepherd would defend the sheep at all cost, including his very life. What a beautiful metaphor for the relationship that we have with Jesus.

If we are the wise and intelligent sheep, we would follow the Good Shepherd. There are so many voices that lead us away from the shepherd, and to the extent that we listen to these voices, to that extent we will find hurt, despair, anxiety, worry, and death. To the extent that we heed His voice in our life, we will find hope, joy, integrity of life, and an inner peace. And so the question we need to ask ourselves: to which shepherd's voice do we listen? Those in the world who seem to have a feel good response, or the one shepherd who invites us to follow Him which includes the cross, the hope of resurrection, and a life of eternal happiness. Hopefully, we will respond as we did in the "responsorial psalm" by living and proclaiming, "We are His people, the sheep of His flock."

As I reflect upon St. Peter Church, one of the things that is apparent is that we need more space as we continue to grow. As such, we do not have a parish center but all of our buildings are being used to their maximum. We have meetings and meetings, with all kinds of differing groups using the space that we have. In light of that, I am proposing that we think about building a cafeteria which would be attached to the grade school. First, it would keep most of our students under one roof which would be more secure for our students. Second, it would allow us to use the current cafeteria for use as a type of parish center so that we could have funeral dinners no longer in the gym but rather below the church, thus keeping the gym available for its use as a gym for our students. Third, if we build a cafeteria, we could build other classrooms on the 2nd floor of this new cafeteria, thus creating more space for our school to grow. And fourth, we could also find new storage space, something that is truly a plus for us. I propose this to you because we have been such great stewards of our treasures and need to expand as our school and parish grows. I wanted to bring this to your attention as we continue to grow and need space. Depending upon the cost, I think that this could be a reality for us in the next year. I will continue to keep you informed as we continue to meet the challenges ahead.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent supports communications projects in the United States and around the world. Let me share with you some examples that show the impact of your generosity to the CCC.

The past couple of years, we have had several major announcements that were critical for the people of our diocese. This included information about how our parishes and schools would operate during the pandemic. There were also exciting announcements about The Evermode Institute coming to Springfield, the Norbertine Fathers from Orange California coming to staff The Evermode Institute, and having all Confirmations and First Holy Communions at the Cathedral, among other positive announcements. We also hosted a diocesan wide listening session via livestream in March in response to Pope Francis' upcoming Synod on Syondality. *Catholic Times* put together a special edition dedicated solely to the sacrament of confession in hopes of encouraging people to go receive forgiveness from God, helping them face their fear, providing a step-by-step instruction, and printing confession times in our diocese.

Over the past year, our diocese has been able to build upon several popular media endeavors and create new video series that are helping people better connect with our faith. Things like *Hey, Father!*, 73 *Questions, The Benuh Series*, and *Dive Deep*, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, continue to grow and we have received many comments from lay Catholics about them learning something new or helping them grow in their relationship with Christ. Videos were also created to help children and parents prepare for coming to the Cathedral for Confirmation and First Holy Communion. We are also livestreaming Masses from the Cathedral every Sunday and for each Confirmation Mass.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels continue to grow. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese. That shows that the communications content our curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them. With your generosity, we can continue these popular initiatives and bring people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.




