Fourth Sunday of Easter

MAY 8, 2022 Acts 13:14,43-52; Revelation 7:9,14b-17; John 10:27-30

The Fourth Sunday of the Easter season is usually called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Read the entire tenth chapter of John for a fuller explanation of the Good Shepherd.

In the ancient Middle East, the king was often called the shepherd of his people. But for the Hebrews, only God could be the true shepherd, as Psalm 23 says. We are not sheep of an earthly monarch, but of the Lord himself. We must always follow God rather than people.

In John 10, Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd; thus he identifies himself as the Lord. He feeds us and protects us and leads us. But he does more: He lays down his life for his sheep.

The second reading alludes to the fact that the Good Shepherd has laid down his life for his sheep. In the Middle East, sheep were usually kept for wool and for milk, and not for meat.

Shepherds became very attached to their sheep; they gave them names (as we name our pets). The sheep would follow only the voice of their own shepherd (just as our pets usually respond only to our voice).

The word "pastor" means "shepherd." Let us pray that many young men of this parish may respond to the call of the Good Shepherd to share in the ministry of shepherding the flock of Christ.

This Good Shepherd Sunday we thank Jesus the good shepherd for caring for us, His flock.

We have time in these next few weeks, but please make sure you take that time to show him the immensity of his impact here.

How to "Think" About the Food Nooks (Mini Food Pantry)

The Food Nook in front of the Parish Center and 14 other Food Nooks in the community have become a major way that our parish is giving to those in need. A little clarification about these smaller food pantries may be helpful to those who wish to give to this ministry. First of all, the purpose is to provide those in need with a few items to get by until they can receive groceries in another way. Think small like small containers of soups/stews, fruit, vegetables. Think hand held items such as chips, breakfast bars, and crackers. Think small hygiene necessities like soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, washcloths, clean socks, shampoo, and lotion.

The area Food Nooks became popular during the pandemic when COVID caused quarantining and limited store hours. They are also an anonymous way to be served. Some of the people who use the nooks may be homeless or those who move from home to home and do not have actual personal space. Some may just be hungry and need a little something to eat. Food Nook use is not subject to judgment.



PLEASE NOTE: The Food Nooks are not a place to drop clothing or perishable items or your grocery donations for the St. Francis Food Pantry.

(There are containers for non perishable grocery items at each entrance to the church.)



Austin's Army Volunteer Breakfast


