

Love One Another

In this Gospel this Sunday, Jesus says very plainly: "I give you a new commandment: love one another." It's a pretty simple command and one that most of humanity would embrace as worthy of following, but we need to ask ourselves what it means. There are so many different meanings and understandings of love, and not all of them match up with the teachings of Christ and His Church. For our purposes, let's go with the definition of love that comes from St. Thomas Aquinas (found in the catechism): love means willing the good of another. This is a simple but profound definition! It doesn't exclude feelings, but it doesn't mean that there have to be feelings involved. It might include both simple and heroic actions. When we will the good of another person, we choose what is best for them - just like the Lord does for us. So, love one another...choose their good! It's a pretty simple commandment, but it can be lived heroically!
