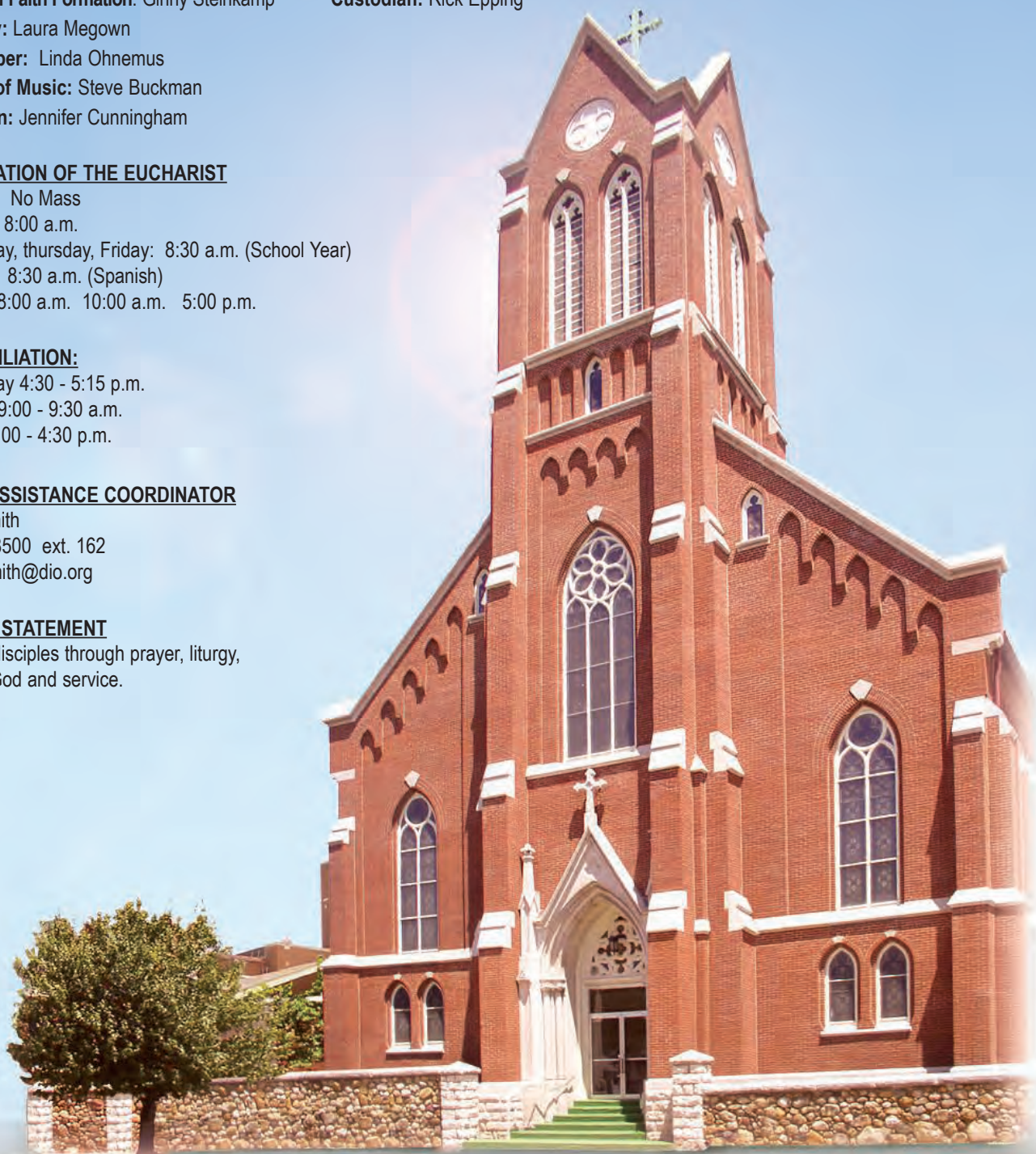

Faith Formation



June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. One way to grow in your love for Christ this month is to enthrone an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in your home and in your hearts. Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, "I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored." The Enthronement Ceremony is one way to do that! Below is a modified version of this devotional practice. Feel free to do your own research for other ways to let Jesus' Sacred Heart reign in your heart and in your home.

1. It is desirable to have a priest preside at the ceremony, but it is not essential. In the event that a priest is not available, the head of the household or other family member may lead the prayers.
2. If possible, attend Mass and offer it that morning for the reign of the Sacred Heart in your home, and as an act of love and reparation to the Sacred Heart.
3. Presider prays, "Let us pray Almighty and everlasting God, who does approve the painting and sculpturing of the images of Your saints, so that as often as we gaze upon them we are reminded to imitate their deeds and sanctity; vouchsafe, we implore You, to bless and sanctify this picture made in honor and in memory of the Most Sacred Heart of Your only begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ; and grant that whosoever, in its presence, will suppliantly worship and honor the Most Sacred Heart of Your only begotten Son, may obtain through His merits and intercession grace in this life and everlasting glory in the world to come. Through Christ our Lord. Amen." The presider sprinkles the picture with holy water.
4. The presider then places the image in a place of honor which can be decorated with objects such as flowers or candles.
5. All stand and recite the *Apostles Creed*.
6. The presider then leads the family in the prayer of consecration to the Sacred Heart.
7. The presider here asks those present to say together one *Our Father* and *Hail Mary* for all absent members, both living and dead.

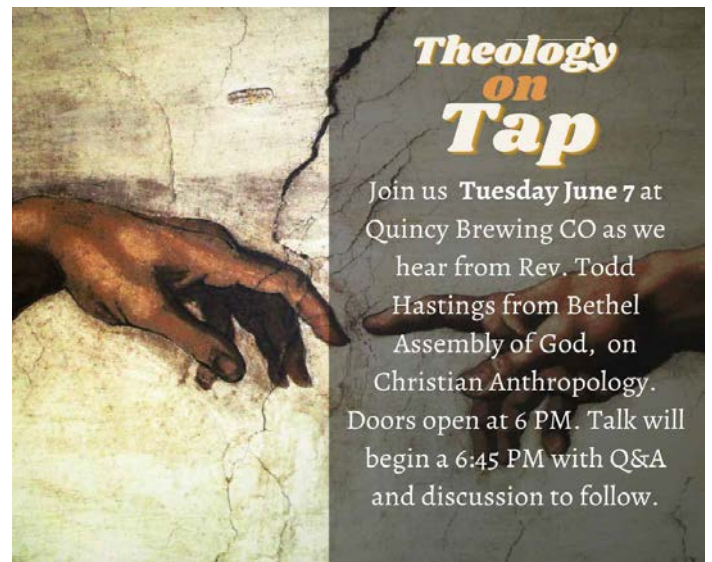
