

#### "On the Q/T..."

From the devotional, God Calling, the meditation of June 20: "Wait to hear my will and then obey. At all costs obey. Do not fear. I am a wall of protection around you. See this. To see this with the eyes of faith is to cause it to manifest in the material."

### On to the question from Fr. Tony:

I think most people have at least heard about parents telling their children not to let the door slam as they run outside, their children saying "OK!," or "Yes!," Mom or Dad: at the exact time they're letting the door slam! Wait. Listen. Obey: seems so easy. But I'll bet God hears His children letting the door slam constantly, even as we claim we're waiting...listening...obeying.

So, how about this question: When have I not waited and am now dealing with the messy consequences...not listened because of something or someone I wanted my way...not obeyed because it would have been too hard to face what I know deep down I should have done – not done – when standing in the face of God?

So very important to keep it simple: Wait. Listen. Obey. How can I get better at that?


