

"On the Q/T..."

From the book, A Simple Path, on Saint Teresa of Calcutta, by Lunicda Varney: "I can tell you about my path," said Mother Teresa, "But I'm only a little wire - God is the power. Talk to others, the sisters and the brothers and the people who work with them. You will know what it is when you see it. It is very beautiful."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

You will know what it is when you see it: what's the "it"? What is Saint Teresa talking about? She's talking about her simple path, winding its way through her presence with the poorest of the poor: calls it "beautiful." She's right, and perhaps you've found out the same thing – at least you're on your way to finding out.

So, how about this question: Have I tired myself out enough that I've begun to look for the "it" Saint Teresa's talking about? A Simple Path? Of course, before looking for that path, there should be some idea of where it's going to wind up. Let's say your destination is contentment in your life, because you've found out how God is carving out His place in it. Remember: can't break any commandments, or fudge on any other divine laws; after all, there are boundaries. A saint says it's beautiful when you see it. Have you ever pinpointed what it is you're actually looking for?


A Spiritual Communion
