**Unity in Diversity**

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, it's a great chance for us to look at how the Holy Spirit brings about unity...and how that differs so greatly from some of the forced unity of human institutions. The totalitarian regimes of the 20th Century focused on unity by strict conformity; if you weren't exactly the same in some instances you were literally put to death! As we hear from the Acts of the Apostles, however, those who heard the message of the Gospel proclaimed to them were astoundingly diverse. They were united by a common Gospel message, but each group lived it a little bit differently. As Catholic Christians, then, we need keep in mind constantly: there is a Gospel message that is the same for everyone, but based on cultures and language, it will have many different flavors. So, we can rejoice at being united as well as in being diverse! How amazing God is in His work in His Church!
