## From the Pastor's Desk

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), we are reminded that in the Holy Eucharist, we taste the very presence and mercy of Christ.

The Gospel passage for today is popularly known as the Feeding of the Five

Thousand and this miraculous event is found in all four Gospels. For Luke, whom we hear from today, it takes place in a deserted place, or in some translations, a lonely place. To be deserted means to be uninhabited, empty. To be lonely describes a feeling of bleakness or desolation. We can see how both of these could be proper descriptions.

Perhaps these words also refer to the human condition and the deepest desires of the human heart. The Gospels agree that Jesus was followed by a great crowd into the hill country. What were they after? Some may have come to hear a little more about the Kingdom, inspired by Jesus' hope-filled promise of God's mercy and healing. Perhaps others simply came to see another miracle from one whose words could change lives and whose deeds could do marvelous things. Maybe some were at the last stop in their journey of life with nothing to lose and yet everything to gain. So they are willing, if not eager, to follow Jesus into this lonely, deserted place, willing to risk the growing darkness of day, hunger, and frankly, a long walk home just to be with Jesus.

It is here in this lonely and deserted place that Jesus meets them and their deepest needs in a life-abundant and self-giving way. As we gather to celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, in many ways we are very much like the crowd in the Gospel. We, too, have come to encounter Jesus, with all our hopes and needs. In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and in the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, Jesus creates a Eucharistic world where all experience His Real Presence and the hope of something better. It is here where no one goes hungry!

Today and at every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus meets the needs of His people by giving us His total and unconditional love, while at the same time nourishing us both physically and spiritually. And it is in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Holy Eucharist itself that

we see and come to understand more fully why the Church calls the Holy Eucharist the Source and Summit of our faith.

It is the Source because Jesus, who is truly and fully present in the Holy Eucharist – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – is the Source of our faith. It is the Summit in that our faith is about a sharing in Jesus' Resurrection and life. In the Holy Eucharist, we truly receive the same Jesus – His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – nourishing us for those lonely moments that are so often part of our human experience, reassuring us that God is always present in our lives.

Each time we prepare to receive Holy Communion, we repeat the words of the centurion from the Gospel who encountered that same Jesus: “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed” (Matthew 8:8).

Each and every time we receive this great gift from Heaven, we should do so with fear and trembling, knowing, as St. Paul reminds us, that we are proclaiming Christ's death and Resurrection until He comes again in glory.

In the Liturgy, we join the saints and angels in the worship of the One who has loved us without condition. In the appearance of bread and wine, Christ pours His fullness out to us and meets our most basic needs, to be loved and to be nourished so that we might have Eternal Life with God in Heaven. There is nothing greater!

And now just a few notes:

#### LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK

- Tuesday, June 21 - Obligatory Memorial of St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious. St. Aloysius was a Jesuit scholastic from the princely family of Castiglione who renounced his inheritance in order to enter the Jesuit Order. St. Robert Bellarmine is known to have been his Spiritual Director. St. Aloysius was deeply devoted to the Holy Eucharist, interior prayer, and

charitable service. He died in 1591 at the age of twenty-three, caring for the sick. He is the patron of youth and of students in Jesuit colleges and universities. St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Pray for us!

- Wednesday, June 22 - Optional memorials of St. Paulinus of Nola, Bishop and Saints John Fisher, Bishop and Thomas More, Martyrs.

St. Paulinus was a dedicated Bishop especially during the Visigoth invasions and is known for giving his possessions to the poor. He died in 431. St. Paulinus, Pray for us!

St. John Fisher was Chancellor of Cambridge University, Bishop of Rochester, and dedicated Pastor of souls. He was renowned for his preaching and educational reforms. He was a great defender of Church Tradition against Luther and of the Roman Primacy against Henry VIII. He was martyred by beheading on June 22, 1535. St. John Fisher, Pray for us!

St. Thomas More was Chancellor of England and close friend of Erasmus. He refused to support Henry VIII's divorce of Queen Catherine and his Act of Supremacy. He was also martyred by beheading on July 6, 1535. He is the patron of lawyers, statesmen, and politicians. St. Thomas More, Pray for us!

- Thursday, June 23 - Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. Dating from the Fourth Century in both East and West, the Nativity of St. John the Baptist came to be celebrated in accord with Luke 1:36, six months before the Lord's birth. Quoting John 3:30, St. Augustine found this date (near the summer solstice) appropriate since, after the birth of John, daylight begins to grow shorter, whereas after Jesus' birth, it begins to increase. St. John the Baptist, Pray for us!

Note that the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist is normally celebrated on June 24. This year, however, the celebration of the Solemnity of the

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus takes precedence and so the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist is moved. This is because of how Pentecost falls in the calendar which, of course, is due to how Easter falls in the calendar. The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on the Friday after the Second Sunday after Pentecost.

- Friday, June 24 - Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. See the notation above concerning the date of this celebration each year. This day is also designated the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. I ask you to keep all priests in your prayers and to pray especially for their holiness.

- Saturday, June 25 - Obligatory Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This Memorial occurs on the Saturday following the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and commemorates the joys and sorrows of the Mother of God: her virtues and perfections, her love for God and her Divine Son, and her compassionate love for mankind.

- ANNIVERSARY - Wednesday, June 22, marks the Anniversary of the Installation of our Diocesan Bishop, Thomas John Paprocki in 2010. Please continue to keep Bishop Paprocki and all Bishops in your prayers.

- ADDITIONAL MASSES - Since Deacon Mike will be away, I will be celebrating Mass on Monday, June 20, at 7:00 a.m. at Holy Family. June 20 would be my mother's birthday, and I am happy to offer the Mass for her that day.

As I mentioned above, Friday, June 24, is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In addition to the regularly scheduled Mass at 8:30 a.m. at Holy Family, I will also be offering Mass that evening at St. Thomas at 5:30 p.m.

I am planning to celebrate Mass on Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. at Holy

Family for the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

- COFIRMATION AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - Bishop Paprocki will be celebrating the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, June 25, for our kids at both Holy Family and St. Thomas who have just finished third grade. This is an exciting time. Please keep these kids in your prayers as they receive these Sacraments.

We will be celebrating this at each parish as well. I will be investing the kids who are receiving Confirmation and First Holy Communion with the Brown Scapular, and there will be a reception for the kids and the parish. At Holy Family, this will be after the 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday, June 25. After I invest the kids with the Brown Scapular, we will go over to the school cafeteria for a reception. I invite everyone to join us for this joyous occasion.

The same will happen at St. Thomas on Sunday, June 26, after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Again, after investing the kids with the Brown Scapular, we will go over to the Hall for a reception, and I invite everyone to join us in the celebration.

- FRIDAY MASSES - Just a reminder that Friday Masses at Holy Family will continue to be at 8:30 a.m. even when school is not in session.

- FATHER'S DAY - I want to wish all fathers a Happy Father's Day. Though a secular celebration, we certainly recognize the importance and necessity of fathers in the lives of their children, in married and family life, and in the life of the Church. As I keep all fathers in my prayers, I ask you also to keep fathers in your prayers.

- BABY BOTTLES - This is the weekend to return the baby bottles for the Pregnancy Centers. If you forgot yours, please bring it next week. Thank you for your contributions.

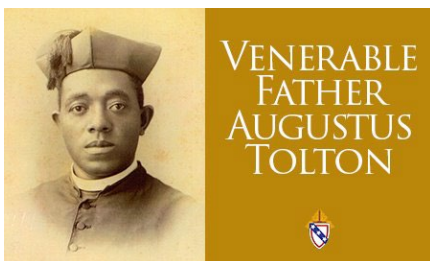

**About Dining in the Kingdom of God.** Luke's gospel is filled with meal stories. Most of them point to the Eucharistic Meal, as does the one today. Four verbs stand out: take, bless, break, give. This is Eucharistic language repeated at every Mass. It is Jesus who truly took and blessed His Body and Blood - broke it and poured it out for each and for all of us - and gives to us to eat and drink so that we may be like Him and act like Him.

- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, how will I be a blessing to family, colleagues, neighbors?
- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, how will I break open my life for the benefit of another?
- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, what will I give away? If stumped, think of the mercy works.
