

Junefest 2022 — Welcome to all who come to celebrate Junefest with us this weekend. Our Junefest committee has been hard at work for months preparing

for this day, and we hope that all will enjoy not only the events and food, but the spirit of the St. Dominic School community who benefit from the proceeds of this event. Thank you to all who are working in the set up and tear-down, all who are working at the stands, all who have brought their families to participate, and our sponsors — all who make Junefest such a wonderful event each year!



Pentecost Sunday marks not the "end" but the "fulfillment" of the Easter season. We have taken time to reflect on our need for renewal and forgiveness and we have meditated on the love of God made manifest in the Cross of Christ. We have been witnesses to the power of His Resurrection as a transformative force in our lives. We have been promised the power of His Spirit to speak to others in the power of His name, being ministers of divine mercy and life to a world in need of renewal. It is this Spirit which sustains, protects, inspires, and empowers

the Church on Earth until His kingdom is realized in its fullness. Thus, we live in what can be reckoned as the "end-times"... the final epoch anticipating the coming of a new and eternal Jerusalem. On that day the Church, purified from sin and made holy by her Redeemer will be as radiant as a bride, coming to meet her bridegroom.

What is our response to this time of grace? It is the Spirit who groans within us, giving words to the unspeakable depths of our souls before the glory of God. Today we welcome again the coming of the Spirit, first given to us in Baptism, stirred up in us at Confirmation, and nourished by each Eucharist. Each prayer and act of worship, each good intention and inspiration, every act of faith, hope, and love are opportunities to grow in the works of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Our response is one of eagerness to do His work and live in the power of His grace, putting aside the slumber of souls enveloped in darkness and indifference. This has been the "reason for the season" which shall sustain us in the year of grace before us.



During the Lent and Easter seasons, Mass has been celebrated at **6 p.m. on Wednesday** nights, in order to provide an additional opportunity for parishioners to attend daily Mass during the week at a different time of day. It has been decided to continue the Wednesday 6 p.m. Mass at St. Anthony's through the summer season until August 10 and the beginning of the new school year. *There will NOT be a 7:30 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays during this time.*

The **Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ** (*Corpus Christi*) falls on the weekend of June 18-19. The US Bishops have announced a three-year initiative called the "Nationwide Eucharistic Revival." During the coming thee years, all of the churches in the United States are being encouraged to inspire greater devotion and understanding of the Holy Eucharist through opportunities for worship and deepening catechesis for all the faithful. The festivities will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in summer of 2024. The Second Vatican Council called the Eucharist the "source and summit of all Christian life." The Eucharist is what holds us in unity as a community of faith. As the opportunities for worship and learning become available, we invite our parishioners to take this opportunity to be "revived" in their Eucharistic faith.
