Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JUNE 26, 2022

1 Kings 19:16b,19-21; Galatians 5:1,13-18; Luke 9:51-62

Elijah was the greatest of the Old Testament prophets. His stories are found in 1 Kings 17-22 and 2 Kings 1-3. When he was about to leave this world, Elijah called Elisha to be his successor.

Elijah expected Elisha to follow him promptly. Apparently, Elisha wants to wind up his business affairs first. As a sign that he would leave his old way of life, Elisha burns the plow he had been using, and offers the oxen in sacrifice.

St. Paul was very angry when he wrote the Letter to the Galatians. The Galatian people were returning to the practices of Judaism. They seemed to think that they were saved by keeping the Law of Moses instead of by faith in Christ Jesus. Paul tells them not to return to the "yoke of slavery." Christ has freed them (and us) from the Torah.

But freedom doesn't mean we can do as we please. We must always seek to please God in a spirit of joy and thanksgiving. By "flesh" Paul means "the natural person who is subject to the effects of original sin." By "spirit" Paul means "the person considered as filled with the grace of Christ." In this sense, the "flesh" is against the "spirit." Let us live by the spirit.

St. Luke makes a great drama of Jesus' journey up to Jerusalem for his "Exodus" or his return to his Father. Today, we begin that journey. Several people want to follow Jesus on his journey. But they all seem to want to take care of worldly affairs first.

Jesus asks for prompt and loyal service. This world will take care of itself, if only we are loyal to him. Let us pray that we shall always put God in first place in our lives. If we serve him promptly, loyally, and generously, he will take care of everything else in our lives.

On this last weekend of June, the Church, after celebrating three differing Solemnities, now returns to Ordinary Time, namely the 13th Sunday. In our gospel for this weekend, we find Jesus on His journey to Jerusalem. In this journey, He is going through Samaria, but the Samaritans would not welcome Him. It is interesting to note that two of Jesus' followers, namely James and John, were ready to call down fire upon the Samaritans because of their attitude toward Jesus. It's interesting to note that these two apostles apparently had a temper as they are known as "sons of thunder." Being patient, Jesus rebukes them as they head to another village. Then we find Jesus calling people to follow Him as He goes. But the invitations were rejected with a variety of excuses. One expects to find an easy life if accepted, but Jesus reminds him that He has no permanent home. Another would follow but found an excuse to bury his father. The request to bury seems simple enough, but Jesus uses the occasion to teach that the kingdom must be more important than any considerations of the world. Whatever the case, Jesus continues to extend the invitation to follow Him in each of our lives. And what excuse do we have in not accepting?

This weekend is the last weekend that Fr. Pavel Luczak will be with us. After serving the Lord here for two years, Fr. Pavel will be transferred to St. Thomas Church, Newton, Illinois, and to St. Mary Church in Ste. Marie, Illinois. Since I am well acquainted with both of these parishes, I can say that these two parishes are excellent assignments for him and that as parochial vicar in both of these places, he will do rather well as he continues to learn the ropes of being a pastor. Since this is his last weekend with us, there will be a reception for him after all of our Masses in the cafeteria of the church. Please join Fr. Pavel and thank him for his service to our parish.

Then next Friday, July 1, we welcome Fr. Zachary Samples as our new parochial vicar. He is newly ordained, and we look forward to his service and priestly ministry here among us at St. Peter Church.

Also, this week from Thursday to Sunday, I will be at the Men's Cursillo out at Quincy North Campus, serving as the Spiritual Director. I ask your prayers for all of us, team and candidates, as we open our lives and hearts to the gift of the Holy Spirit.

As I announced at three of the Masses last weekend, we will begin to say the St. Michael the Archangel prayer after the final blessing and before the final song. The prayer will be shown on the screen, and I ask you to join in and pray it together. The Bishop has asked all of the parishes to pray this prayer.

On July 9, to commemorate the 125th anniversary of the death of Venerable Servant of God Augustine Tolton, Bishop Paprocki will lead a procession from St. Peter's Church to Fr. Tolton's grave in St. Peter Cemetery, where he will offer the Holy Mass. The procession will begin at 10:00 a.m. and the Mass will begin at 11:00 a.m. If unable to walk it, you may park near the cemetery for the Mass. Chairs and bottled water will be available, but you might bring your own.


