Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JULY 3, 2022

Isaiah 66:10-14c; Galatians 6:14-18; Luke 10:1-12,17-20

A theme of joy pervades the texts of today's Mass. The joy comes from the proclamation of Good News. What is the "Good News?" In its essence, it is that God loves us, that he will see us through any crisis, and that he promises us everlasting joy.

The first reading is from the very last chapter of Isaiah. Isaiah sees the joy and peace which will come with God's Messiah. All nations will be united; all will worship together; all will be prosperous; there will be peace. God will triumph.

Isaiah expected that this would happen shortly after the return of the exiles from Babylon; it didn't happen that way. But still we must have hope. The Responsorial Psalm echoes the reading: Let all the earth cry out to God with joy. Proclaim the marvelous deeds of the Lord; think of the blessings he has given you.

The Gospel is the story of Jesus' sending out seventy-two disciples to be his heralds on his way to Jerusalem. They are to proclaim that the reign of God is at hand. When the disciples return, Jesus rejoices even though he is on his way to Jerusalem to suffer and die. He rejoices because he sees Satan fall from heaven. He rejoices because the power of evil will be broken. He rejoices because eternal joy awaits in heaven.

The second reading tells us that we must never boast except in the cross of Christ. This seems strange. We want joy and happiness, yet we are to glory only in the cross! But it is only by our willingness to empty ourselves in sharing the cross of Christ that we shall conquer evil and find true joy.

Why are we sad? Why are we depressed? If we realize that God loves us, that he will always win, and that he will give us eternal life, how can we remain sad? Let us rejoice in God's Good News. Let us live in peace.

I don't know about you, but I'm not ready for this particular weekend. If you are asking why, then you don't understand that this weekend marks the halfway mark of summer vacation. That means half is over and we only have another half to enjoy before school starts up again. Hate to be a downer but I'm living in reality and wanted to share this reality with all of you.


Anyway, this weekend we welcome Fr. Zachary Samples into the St. Peter Parish family as our new parochial vicar. Not only am I confident that he will serve us well, but he also will assist me as a chaplain at Quincy Notre Dame. Apparently I'm not getting any younger as I age so he will be a big help as we try to minister at QND. So this weekend, I ask you to welcome Fr. Samples to our parish, introduce yourselves, and welcome him as our new parochial vicar.

On this particular weekend with personnel changes becoming effective throughout the diocese, our gospel for this weekend is quite appropriate. In our gospel we hear that Jesus appointed seventy two whom He sent ahead of Him in pairs to every town and places He intended to visit. Then He states: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the house to send out laborers for His harvest." A good question we can ask ourselves is when was the last time that each of us prayed for more vocations to the priesthood? Each parish assumes that they will have a priest, but how many parishes have been encouraging, supporting, and praying for more vocations to the priesthood? I would venture to say not many as we just presume that priests will be provided. But if we do not promote vocations in our homes and our parishes, these vocations will become less and less, and then we have no priests to send into the harvest. So I challenge each of you to make it a point to pray for vocations. I firmly believe that God is calling some young men here at St. Peter Parish to become priests like Fr. Samples. Remember the words of Isaiah who was confronted with the words, "Whom shall I send?" To which Isaiah responded, "Here I am Lord, send me." Please pray for more vocations.

This Monday, July 4, is Independence Day and a national holiday. Our country is blessed with many freedoms that we often take for granted. Unfortunately, it is also home to violence, lack of respect for people and opinions, and often a double standard for justice. In spite of these flaws, it is still a country blessed. In that spirit of blessedness, I encourage you to come and celebrate our Eucharist together, thanking God for His blessings upon our country. Our Mass for that day will be at 8:00 a.m. Happy Fourth of July to all!

Next weekend, July 9-10, we will have the collection for Catholic Charities of Quincy. You have special envelopes in your packet of parish envelopes for this collection. Catholic Charities does so much in our community, providing so many special services representing our Church and our morals. I ask you to please be generous. We will hopefully be having speakers from Catholic Charities who will outline for us the ministry and service that this organization provides for our community. Remember the words of Jesus, "Whatever you do for the least of your brothers and sisters, you do for me." Please be generous.
