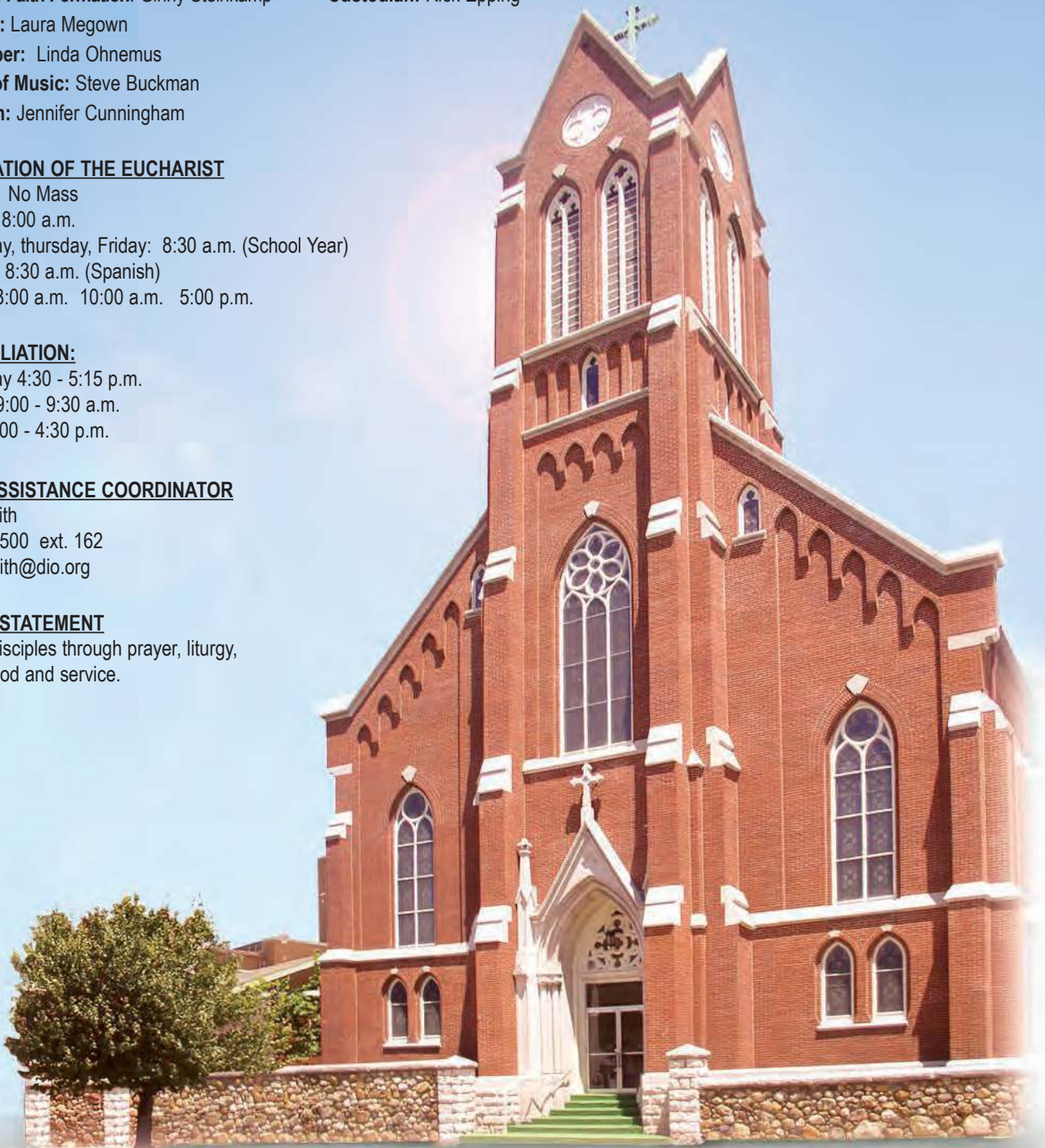

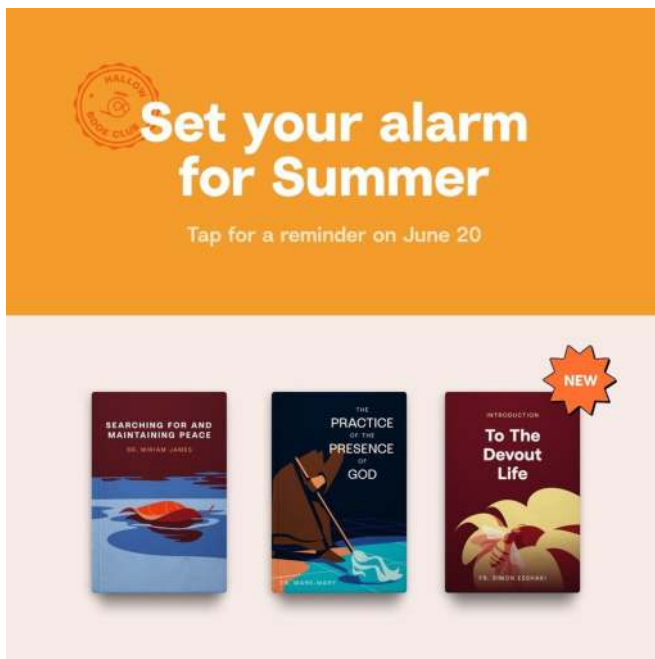

10 Catholic Books You Should Read This Summer

Hopefully, we are all into the swing of our summer schedules. Whether you are looking for ways to fill the hot days or for something to add to your summer reading list, consider these 10 great Catholic reads spanning all genres.

1. *Story of a Soul* — St. Therese

The *Story of a Soul* is the autobiography of a young Carmelite Nun, Saint, and Doctor of the Church. Learn more about her spirituality and “Little Way” of doing small acts with great love for God. This is a great read to ponder in Adoration!

2. *Lord of the Rings* — J.R. Tolkien

This adventure packed trilogy popularized by the Peter Jackson movies and the new adaptation by Amazon Prime is sure to be a page turner for readers of all ages. Journey with Frodo Baggins, a humble hobbit creature, as he learns the cost of power and greed and the value of adventure, friendship, and sacrifice. This novel is full of wizards, elves, dwarves, and even dragons that will capture and entertain the mind of all readers.

3. *The Screwtape Letters* — C.S. Lewis

Sometimes we forget that there is the veiled realm of angels and demons draped over our own. Have you ever wondered what goes through the mind of our tempters? This short, fictional read shares a series of letters written by a senior demon to his nephew, a fledgling tempter, with advice about how to aid humans in falling to temptation. This novel will help readers gain a new awareness of spiritual warfare as well as help in avoiding temptation.

4. *Father Brown Mysteries* — G.K. Chesterton

Who doesn't love a good mystery? This series of short stories written in the early 1900's follows Father Brown, a Catholic Priest in Ireland and amateur detective, to solve murders, bring criminals to justice, and save souls.

5. *The Jewish Roots of the Eucharist* — Brant Pitre

In this work of popular theology, Dr. Brant Pitre pairs together both the Jewish Scripture and Jewish tradition to lay a framework by which the Eucharist can be understood. Learn about our Fathers in Faith and grow in deeper appreciation for our Eucharistic Lord.

6. *The Porn Myth* — Matt Fradd

“*The Porn Myth* is a non-religious response to the commonly held belief that pornography is a harmless or even beneficial pastime.” Matt Fradd collects anecdotes from porn performers and users as well as the knowledge of neurologists, sociologists, and psychologists. This book is available for free on formed.org.

7. *Why Liberalism Failed* — Patrick Deneen

According to Deneen, “We should rightly wonder whether America is not in the early days of its eternal life but rather approaching the end of the natural cycle of corruption...” This book argues that liberalism has “exhausted itself” and explores why.

8. *Our Lady's Wardrobe* — Anthony Destefano

The children's picture book introduces young boys and girls to our Blessed Mother in a way like never before! Join Mary as she picks out special outfits to visit the people of the world!

9. *Interior Castle* — St. Teresa of Avila

St. Teresa received a vision from Jesus, picturing “the soul as if it were a castle...in which there are many rooms, just as in Heaven there are many mansions.” Learn about the spirituality of St. Teresa and how to invite Christ into your own “Interior Castle.”

10. *The End of the Affair* — Graham Greene

This drama is for mature readers only. Bendrix narrates the story of the end of his affair and his exploration of belief in God. Set in London, this examines themes of jealousy, relationships, and room for God in our lives. This novel is considered to be a masterpiece of Greene.
