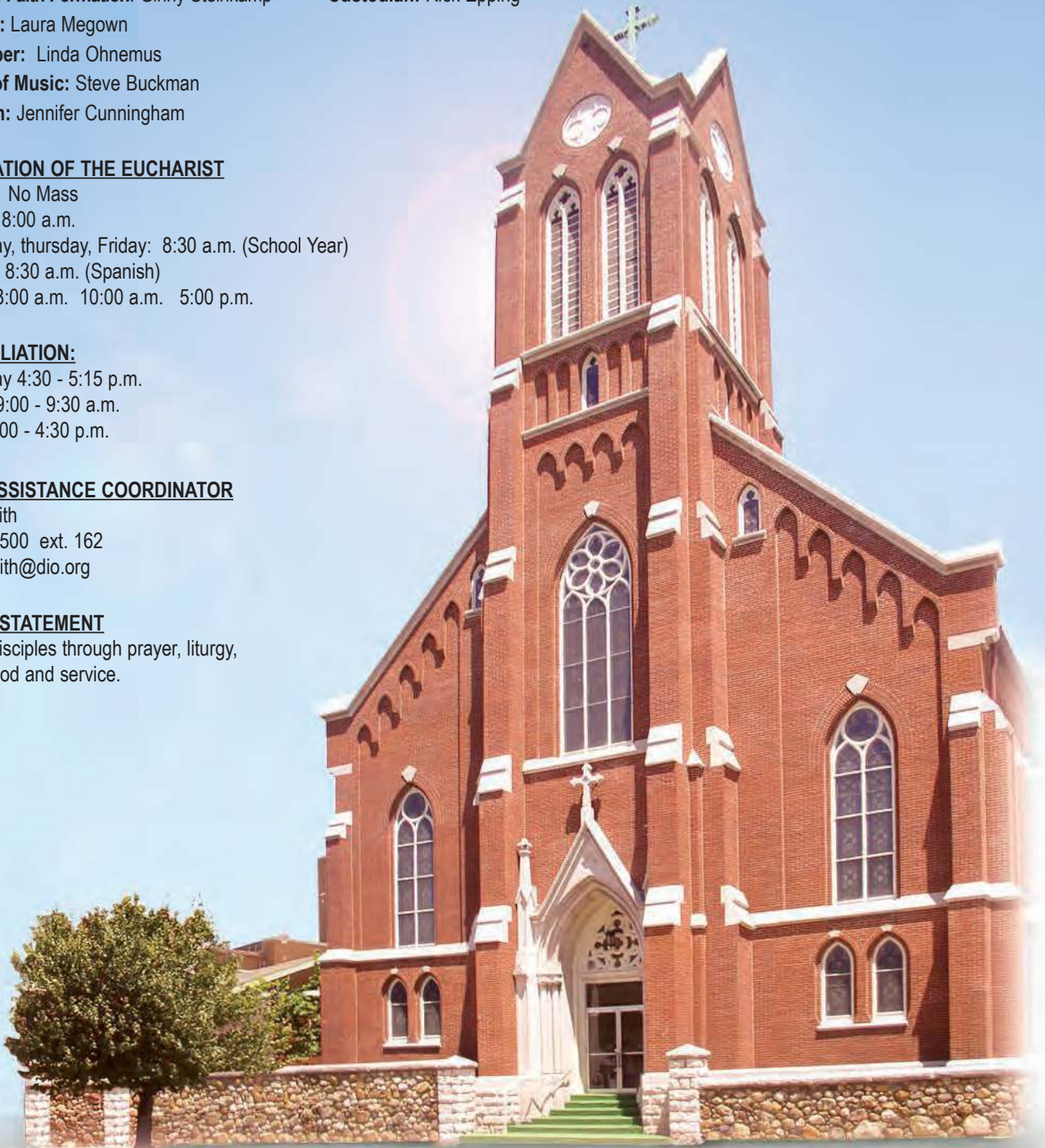

Today we celebrate the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the gospel story Jesus speaks to us about the importance of *perseverance in prayer*. “For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.” Prayer isn’t so much about changing God’s mind. Prayer is more about aligning my own heart with the will of God. So persevering in prayer may not mean getting the things I want. Rather it may mean accepting the path that lies ahead, and trusting in the Lord who walks that path with me.

Finally, it is time to begin thinking about RCIA. In a few weeks we will begin our next season of weekly RCIA sessions for those considering entrance into the Catholic faith. The first several months of RCIA are considered a period of “Inquiry” when participants have a chance to learn more about the Catholic faith without making any specific commitments. Family Faith Formation Explained

What We're Up Against

According to a study conducted by Gallup, **"From 2014 to 2017, an average of 39% of Catholics reported attending church in the past seven days. This is down from an average of 45% from 2005 to 2008 and represents a steep decline from 75% in 1955."** If we believe the Eucharist is the "source and summit of our faith" and the spiritual nourishment for our souls, this is a huge problem. All the research suggests that parents play the largest role in kids keeping the faith. "One of the most basic suggestions of our findings is that young adults arrive at a sense of their fundamental identity and worldview...by roughly adopting the worldview of those mentors who left the deepest impression upon them—and who loved them and cared for them the most. It should come as no surprise, then, that the emergence of the new generation of dedicated young Catholics will rise and fall with the choices of their parents." (Bartkus and Smith, 70) Additionally, parents are losing more and more oversight and control over their children's education—religious or otherwise. It is time that parents be empowered to be the first educators that they are called to be and be given resources to fulfill the promise that they made at their child's baptism "of training him [or her] in the practice of the faith."

Family Faith Formation As a Solution

A religion class multiple times a week, Sacramental prep, excellent catechists, etc. are a great start, but your kids need YOU. While this is a huge responsibility, you don't have to do it on your own. The family faith formation model provides community support and resources to parents for critical aspect of your vocation. Not all of us are theologians, philosophers, or teachers, but we all love Christ, and we all love our kids. The family faith formation model is meant to help parents share this love of Christ with their kids (theology degree not required).

Blessed Sacrament's "Domestic Church Circle"

Pope Paul VI describes the "domestic church" in his *Evangelii Nuntiandi* writing, "This means that there should be found in every Christian family the various aspects of the entire Church. Furthermore, the family, like the Church, ought to be a place where the Gospel is transmitted and from which the Gospel radiates." Starting in September 2022, Blessed Sacrament Parish will begin offering an opportunity for family faith formation called the "Domestic Church Circle." The goal of this monthly gathering is to support parents in this endeavor described by Pope Paul VI. We will do this by providing relevant formation for parents and students within the context of small groups. The parent session will be an opportunity

to receive information and techniques for the transmission of the Gospel to their children as well as provide fellowship and community with other parents striving towards this same noble goal. Additionally, parents will receive resources/curriculum to use with their children during the weeks leading up to the next "Domestic Church Circle" meeting as well as strategy and discussion on how to successfully share this formation with their children. Simultaneously, children will enter into grade specific groups that will focus on faith formation, prayer, fellowship, and a reinforcement of the lessons that parents will be teaching at home.
