

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the gospel story we hear the Parable of the Rich Fool. The rich man has so much in abundance that he chooses to tear down his barns and build larger ones. Jesus tells us, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." We often compare our own wellbeing with the material wellbeing of others. This can become a source of personal unhappiness and resentment. Happiness comes not in building riches, but in building friendships that are rich in meaning.

Finally, it is time to begin thinking about RCIA. In a few weeks we will begin our next season of weekly RCIA sessions for those considering entrance into the Catholic faith. The first several months of RCIA are considered a period of "Inquiry" when participants have a chance to learn more about the Catholic faith without making any specific commitments. 




