

#### "On The Q/T..."

From the book, A Simple Path, Mother Teresa, by Lucinda Varney: "What is not widely understood is why Mother Teresa and the women and men of her order live the way they do - and whether, in this age of complication and confusion, she has anything relevant and accessible to say to those searching for a better way of life at the end of the twentieth century...

#### On to the question from Fr. Tony:

Did I ever tell you about the day I rode my bike back from the eye doctor, so pleased and satisfied that I could see so much better with my new glasses. Then my eye started itching, and I put my finger right through where the lenses were supposed to be in the frame: no lenses! And most of the way home, I thought I could see better! We think we see the world and people around us so clearly, but a certain set of lenses is missing: our own suffering, our hurts, our rude awakenings from life's unwelcome surprises. Try those lenses on: now, you see others in their suffering, hurts, and rude awakenings.

So how about this question: What does your world...what do the people around you...need? Now that some real lenses allow you to see them better?

Whether, as a parishioner who's already offered yourself to this ministry, or as one who senses a call to begin: let's see who wants to help out in this area of our Church life. By now, you know we have rules. You should love the Mass and be there without fail, except for dire circumstances keeping you from the Eucharist; your moral life and behavior should be exemplary, supported by the sacrament of Confession; and while divorce itself doesn't prevent you from being an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, re-marriage outside the Church without annulment from the previous marriage does. Be aware: when we visit nursing homes or hospitals, we're bound to wear masks - can't change that. When we visit homes, we have to respect the wishes of the resident, whose preference could go either way. Please contact the Rectory and let us know of your renewed or recent interest. We'll take it from there!

**ROSARY AND DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET ON FACEBOOK** This is the other of the two things we had better address right away. Fr. Tony is very recently getting acquainted with Facebook, from what I hear. And I should know: I'm Fr. T!! But at home, on the road, or at various locations, there's no way a single priest can make better use of time and availability than by having a group to help out with what has turned out to be a feature that's here to stay. So while Fr. Tony is getting familiar with Facebook, please contact the Rectory and let us know of your interest.

**REMEMBER?** I heard you say it: "Father, let us know if there's anything, anything at all, we can do to help you." OK. Here it comes. And that's what you said.


#### A Spiritual Communion
