CONTINUING GRATITUDE AND APPRECIATION Responses to our requests for Pastoral Care Visitation to the Sick and Homebound, Rosary and Divine Mercy on Facebook, and for our bus drivers (our efforts have yielded two) are much appreciated. More is coming. We intend to return to the Sign of Peace and Communion under both forms at Mass, servers and other liturgical ministries, and efforts aimed at the spiritual growth of various age groups. But please let me remind you - and you, please, remind others - that the help we need in various areas can't depend on your convenience. RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS 2022-23 We are just over a month away from the beginning of the coming years' RCIA. RCIA is for those who want to know how to get to Heaven, how to follow Jesus here on earth, and what and why the Church teaches what she does. RCIA is for 1) the unbaptized who wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church; 2) baptized Christians who find in Catholicism the "extra step" needed to enter into the fullness of the Christian faith; 3) already baptized Catholics who are seeking the Sacrament of Confirmation and/or renewal of what they had learned in previous years; and 4) those who are simply inquiring or searching with no expectation of commitment but interested in learning more about Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church. For post-Vatican II Catholics, it wouldn't hurt to renew and update your Catholic faith through RCIA, as several folks have experienced a greatly improved faith life much to their surprise.

RCIA takes place on Sundays from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Each session begins with a 20-minute session on the treasury of the Church's prayer, followed by a 40-minute teaching session. After a 20-minute break for refreshments (referred to as "Grazing", a.k.a. feasting), another 40-minute teaching session concludes the evening. There are no expenses or fees for participation. Each participant will receive the following: "Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible Workbook; Life in Christ Catechism; Catechism of the Catholic Church; and the Didache Bible.

We begin on Sunday, August 28, and plan to end the Sunday after Easter.
