
18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



From the Desk of the DRE: As part of our visit with family and friends this summer, my children and I attended a Eucharistic Congress for Families in Tyler, Texas. The windows and furnishings illumine my three themes for faith formation during the Eucharistic Revival. Year 1: Jesus Christ, Present in the Eucharist. Jesus Christ is the fulcrum of history. Year 2: Salvation History-Jesus Christ concealed in the Old Testament and revealed in the New. The four creatures represent the Evangelists: Sts. Matthewman, Mark-lion, Luke-ox, and John-eagle. Knowing the Bible is knowing Jesus Christ whom we receive and understanding the deep union with us He desires and gives. Year 3: Jesus Christ revealed in the lives of the Saints. Each saint reflects a different facet of the brilliance of the Light of Christ. The saints together in friendship show us the life of Christ. Below are saints who helped each other get to Heaven: Sts. Francis and Clare, John Bosco and Dominic Savio, John Paul II and Teresa of Calcutta. In baptism, God calls each of us to be a Saint! 
