## Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary 7ime JULY 17, 2022

Genesis 18:1-10a; Colossians 1:24-28; Luke 10:38-42

In the nomadic culture of the ancient Middle East, hospitality was the principal virtue. Even an enemy had to be treated as a brother as long as he was under your tent. In the first reading, Abraham shows this kind of hospitality to three "strangers." He was rewarded by the promise that his free wife, Sarah, would have a son.

But, as important as hospitality was, Jesus says that there is something even more important: Listening to and reflecting on his word are more important than the details of hospitality.

Someone must do the cooking and cleaning up. We must never permit others to work while we play. But when a friend visits, we should pay attention to the friend, and not to minute details of hospitality. How much more should we pay attention to our friend, Jesus, who is always with us? Martha is the ideal church worker; Mary is the ideal disciple.

The second reading teaches the value of our crosses when offered in union with Christ. We are one with him in the Mystical Body, the Church. Our words, works, and prayers, take on a new and infinite dimension when offered through and with Christ.

We participate in the very redemptive act of his cross. In this reading, Paul also marvels at the great "mystery" of God's mercy. Jews hated non-Jews (Gentiles), and non-Jews (Gentiles) hated Jews. The "mystery" is that God has brought the two together in Jesus Christ.

## Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our readings for this weekend speak to us of a virtue for which we have been striving as a parish, namely, the virtue of hospitality. I only hope that our parishioners here at St. Peter recognize this virtue as very much being a part of our goal as a parish, namely, to be a stewardship parish. This means that we make others feel welcome here at St. Peter, from the time that they enter our doors to the time that they leave. If we give the impression of being a parish of hospitality, then we can be assured that they will return again to worship with us. Too often we become so busy with things that clutter our lives, often center our lives on people with whom we feel comfortable, that we fail to welcome the new family, or fail to recognize a new person among us. I challenge our ushers and our parishioners that if you see someone new, just go out of your way to welcome them to our celebration. Remember our stewardship prayer that prays: "My church will be friendly, if I am."

Our first reading is from the Book of Genesis. Three men come to visit Abraham who opens up his tent and his family to these visitors. Abraham bathes their feet, gives them rest from the sun in some shade, slaughters a steer and bakes some bread, and feeds and nourishes them as he shows that virtue of hospitality. In return, when the strangers leave, they promise that at this same time the next year that Sarah will have a son. The one desire that both Abraham and Sarah had was that desire to be parents and yet this desire was unfulfilled. But because of their hospitality to these strangers, because of their hospitality toward these visitors, the desire of being parents will be fulfilled. Sarah would conceive and she and Abraham would have their long-awaited son, Isaac. In the letter to the Hebrews, we hear the author say to us: "Do not neglect to show hospitality, for by that means some have entertained angels without knowing it."

Then in our Gospel we hear of the family Mary and Martha who opened up their home to this man from Nazareth, named Jesus. These women who would become an important part of Jesus' life would welcome Jesus and feed Him with food and support Him with their love. Jesus was truly at home with them and from them He would refresh Himself with their friendship. But our Gospel today shows a little frustration on the part of Martha, as she seemed to be doing the work while Mary sat at the feet of Jesus. Then we hear Jesus say, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing and Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." We can be anxious over many things, but when we, like Mary, sit and listen to Jesus in our prayers, the anxieties and worries melt away. A great lesson to be learned.

This weekend we welcome Fr. Francis Valentine Odoom from the diocese of Cape Coast, Ghana, who is here to speak to us from the Missionary Co-Op of our diocese. He will be asking for any financial support for his diocese and the work that they are doing. I ask you to listen and then give generously as you always do. Special envelopes may be found in the pews.
