Genesis 18:20-32;

Colossians 2:12-14;

Luke 11:1-13

A general theme for today's Mass might be: "Persevere in prayer." Quite often, the theme of the Mass is summed up in the Responsorial Psalm. Today, the refrain for the psalm is: "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me."

The first reading is a very primitive account of "Semitic bargaining" between Abraham and God. The cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were proverbial for their corruption. Evil demands the judgment of God. But Abraham keeps reminding God how good he is. Surely God wouldn't want anyone to say that he destroyed the innocent with the guilty!

Abraham keeps bargaining and pleading. Unfortunately, there were not even ten good people in Sodom. In the Gospel, Jesus gives the Lord's Prayer as the model of all prayer. We pray that God may be recognized by all people, that his will be done, that he will give us our needs, that he will forgive us as we forgive others, and that he will protect us from the final cataclysm.

Jesus says that if we, as bad as we are, know how to give good things to our children, how much more will God give us his blessings, if we have faith. We must always keep asking; we must keep knocking on the Lord's door.

The second reading gives us confidence in our prayer: We don't ask God to hear us because of our merits. Rather, we ask him to hear us because of Christ, and because we belong to Christ.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 24, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

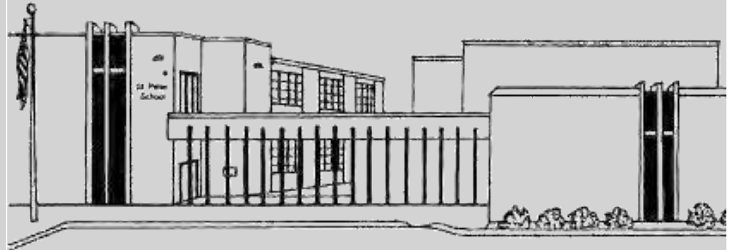
Just to let you know, I had a very relaxing trip to Frankenmuth, Michigan. Did I buy some things at Bronner's, the largest Christmas store in the world? Yes, I must admit that I did. Going through that store makes Christmas in July a real experience. The only downfall is the nine to ten-hour trip. But it was worth it and I enjoyed the four days in Frankenmuth.

I want to thank you for the warm welcome that you gave last weekend to Fr. Francis Odoom from Ghana. He remarked how hospitable you were, how welcoming you were. After our readings for the weekend, I can only say how proud I was of you for making hospitality a living virtue in our community. It says so much about how we are living our way of stewardship in our parish. Thank you.

One of the qualities of our prayer must always be perseverance. I remember the old saying that prayer does not change God but it does change us. And so today we have perseverance as a theme for our Eucharist. In our first reading from the Book of Genesis, we encounter the story of Sodom and Gomorrah, two cities that were filled with sin. God was about to bring destruction upon them. What we find next is Abraham bargaining with God over these two cities. Abraham was pleading that these cities not be destroyed since there might be innocent people living among them. And so what we find next is Abraham pleading with God, saying, "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people, would you spare the cities?" And so the bargaining continues until Abraham finally gets the number down to at least ten innocent. And the Lord replies, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it." What I find interesting about this reading is not only perseverance in prayer but also a human trait that often appears in our prayer, namely, bargaining with our God. In many instances in which we find ourselves powerless, we often turn to God in prayer and bargain with Him. How many times have we said, "God, if you only answer my prayer, I will change my ways." Some times our prayer is answered the way we want, and other times it's not. But so often what happens is that we never follow through on our promises. So much for bargaining with our God. But this reading emphasizes that we should always persevere in our prayer with God. Never give up but continue to pray. Our gospel also emphasizes perseverance in prayer as Jesus tells the apostles the story of the friend who comes to another at Midnight for a loaf of bread. When the friend does not open the door, Jesus tells them that if the friend does not "get up to the visitor because of their friendship he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of persistence." So remain persistent in prayer as it truly will change us.

We welcome this weekend our team from Totus Tuus who will be directing this program for our young people this week. The word Totus Tuus comes from St. John Paul II's motto which comes from the Latin meaning "totally yours." This program is presented with St. Francis Church for our young people during the day and our older students in the evening. Please consult the bulletin for more details.

Haiti Sister Parish Update

Greetings from Haiti,

Father Michel continues to keep us apprised of the conditions in his country and the activities at Our Lady of the Assumption, St. Leo and St. John the Baptist Churches. Unfortunately, kidnappings of priests and their associates have not stopped. Recently, Fr. Claircius Dorvilus and three others at his Rectory in Port de Paix were kidnapped by gang members. Out of very real concern for his personal safety, Father Michel decided to move forward with plans to improve security on his church grounds and Rectory in Passe-Reine by construction of a wall.

Within the past month St. Peter Church wired money from the Haiti Sister Parish account to help with such expenses as food for parishioners, church maintenance, and any needed parish projects. Fr. Michel reports that his primary concern is the country's food insecurity and its impact on his parishioners. He will use some of this money to feed his people and some to construct a portion of the wall.

St. Peter Church also sent money from the Scholarship Program that is funded by individual parishioners and two parish groups to provide for the education of 28 students. Thanks to those sponsors the students will be able to attend the 2022-2023 school year.

Fr. Michel continues to bring the sacraments to his people. In June he officiated at First Communion services at Our Lady of the Assumption for 19 communicants and 24 communicants at St. John the Baptist.

On behalf of Fr. Michel and his parishioners, thank you for your prayers and ongoing financial support.
