

**ANNUAL MISSIONARY APPEAL, AUGUST 13-14** Fr. Nicodemus Muithi is from the Catholic Diocese of Kitui, Kenya. He has recently arrived from Kenya to assist the Catholic Diocese of Peoria and travel around the U.S. doing mission appeals in the summer for the Kitui Diocese. He was ordained in 2005. The Kitui Diocese is in a sub-Saharan plain, where one of the greatest challenges is drought and famine. Access to clean water and ample rain are a constant challenge for everyone there. Most people rely on subsistence farming to feed their families. This is difficult in times of drought. The trickle-down effect influences everything including education, since schools close without clean water and fees for tuition are redirected to buy food since the crops fail. The burden that many feel during these times of need leave them feeling hopeless if not for their faith. Your support during this mission appeal is vital for the hope it provides.

#### **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS 2022-23**

We are just a few weeks away from the beginning of the coming years' RCIA. RCIA is for anyone who wants to know how to get to Heaven, how to follow Jesus here on earth, and what and why the Church teaches what she does. This includes: 1) the unbaptized who wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church; 2) baptized Christians who are exploring how to enter into the fullness of the Christian faith; 3) already baptized Catholics who are seeking the Sacrament of Confirmation or renewal of what they learned in previous years; and 4) those who are simply inquiring or searching with no expectation of commitment but interested in learning more about Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church. For older Catholics, it wouldn't hurt to renew and update your Catholic faith through RCIA. Several folks have experienced a greatly improved faith life through participation, much to their surprise.

RCIA takes place on Sundays from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Each session begins with a 20-minute session on the treasury of the Church's prayer, followed by a 40-minute teaching session. After a 20-minute break for food and refreshments, another 40-minute teaching session concludes the evening. There are no expenses or fees for participation. **We begin on Sunday, August 28, and plan to end the Sunday after Easter.**


