



Welcome to all who join us this weekend for the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick. As we encounter this celebration, there are two items that seem opportune to address:

First, we continue to ask that those who are hospitalized, in nursing facilities, or at home, as well as those who care for them, to consider when requesting the sacrament to do so in as timely a way as possible. While most pandemic-induced complications involving entrance into healthcare facilities are lifted, there are occasions where access to a facility or a patient requires extra steps in the current environment.

These are best handled when the situation is not an emergency.

Also, as Deacon has asked in a note that we have published in the bulletin over the last several weeks, please do not wait to call for the sacrament, especially when it seems that a situation is "terminal." Death isn't always predictable! Waiting for final family members to arrive from distant places, assuming hospice personnel know for sure that death is still more than 24 or 48 or 72 hours away, assuming that I or another priest can be immediately available, or delaying out of hope that things will just sort of "work themselves out" are all attitudes that can result in a missed opportunity for this important final sacrament! It is optimal to be able to celebrate the sacrament with family gathered and with the patient able to receive consolation from the celebration. Indeed, the complete celebration of "Last Rites" presumes that the patient can make a sacramental confession and receive Holy Communion as Viaticum. In these cases, it is best not to wait too long so that the entire rite can be celebrated!

Secondly, this is a time to spotlight opportunities for volunteers for ministries to the sick that operate in the name of the parish. Consider accepting an invitation to join us in the following ministries (a volunteer card is included, or you can call the Parish Office, 222-5996):

<u>Communion to the Sick at Blessing Hospital:</u> Catholic patients at Blessing Hospital are visited daily with the opportunity to receive Holy Communion. This is also an opportunity to see if a parish priest needs to be called to provide other sacraments such as the anointing or confession. Volunteers need to be able to be mandated as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (i.e., a practicing Catholic in good standing) and be physically able to carry out that ministry (walking through Blessing hospital). Blessing Hospital requires a background check and training for this ministry.

Assistance to Good Samaritan Residents for Mass: Parishioners go throughout the home to assist residents in coming from their rooms to the chapel for Mass on Thursday by 10 a.m. Others help by setting the chapel up for Mass. Good Samaritan home requires a simple background check and training to prepare volunteers to assist with this ministry!

<u>Communion to the Homebound on Sundays</u>: Parishioners are sent out from Mass to visit several homes and take Holy Communion to the homebound. If we had more ministers, we could reach more homebound! Parishioners will need to be mandated as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and to be able to carry out that ministry, and they will need to be able to drive/travel locally to visit homes.

Parish Nurse Ministry: This is a ministry open to RN's, LPN's, and other nursing professionals. Parish Nurses visit in hospitals, skilled cared facilities, and in homes to provide spiritual care and advocacy for parishioners with healthcare concerns or needs. They often assist church members to find support for meals, transportation, grief and loss support, and other visits. Formal and informal training is available to qualified nurses, who always operate within the bounds and standards of their professional qualifications.



I have had more reports that someone is using my name to solicit people by email and texts, saying that I have an emergency requiring payment in gift cards. Most people already know this, but this is an obvious scam. But as I plan to be out of the country in a few weeks making such scams seem plausible, let it be known that I have sufficient ability using credit cards and insurance services offered by the diocese to get out of any vulnerable travel situation I might find myself in. And in any case, I would NEVER request any funds sent

by gift cards. If you should be taken in by such as scam, do not be ashamed or silent about it! Report the incident to the police! Remind everyone you know that this is a scam and the only reason scammers are still doing it is that it seems that there are good-hearted people who are taken in.
