Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 7, 2022

Wisdom 18:6-9; Hebrews 11:1-2,8-19;
Luke 12:32-48

None of us is going to get out of this alive! To prove the point, do you know of anyone who is 150 years old? They have all gone. Some time in the future, each one of us will be called to give an account of our lives before God, the just Judge who cannot be deceived. Today's readings tell us to live in faith and expectation, to be ready for God's summons, for we don't know when it will come.

The first reading is from Wisdom. The reading describes the expectation of the Israelites in Egypt for their deliverance. They kept hoping and waiting. But Wisdom was actually written a thousand years after the Exodus. It was written to encourage many Jews who were again living in Egypt.

Unfortunately, these Jews in Egypt were prospering greatly; they were attracted to the pagan culture of Hellenism. The author of Wisdom urges them to look back to the faith of their forefathers.

The second reading tells us that faith is the realization of what we hope for, the evidence of what we believe. The reading gives us examples of people who lived by their convictions.

The Gospel is an unlikely story to teach a truth. It is very unlikely that any master would ever wait on his servants! But the parable says this! If we are loyal to Christ, and if we keep wide awake in our faith, he will surely be our Savior, our Paraclete, our Mediator. He will share his heavenly banquet with us.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 7, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

In our gospel for this 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus says something profound and often very descriptive of our lives. He says, “for where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.” Perhaps this gives us an occasion to look at our lives and discover where our heart is and thus discover our treasures. The question we might have to ask ourselves is how do we discover where our heart is. The determining factor for anything important in our lives is where we put our time. Where we put our time, that’s where our heart is. And where our heart is, then we discover our treasure.

Jesus also tells a parable in this same gospel about the prudent servant whom the master puts in charge of his servants to distribute food at the proper time. The point of the parable is the prudent servant is expected to fulfill his assignment regardless of any delays in the master’s coming. Then the conclusion of the gospel parable is thus: “Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.” Each of us is entrusted with a faith, a hope, and a love. These gifts are treasures the Lord gives to us. If these are entrusted to us, then we are expected to make them priorities in our lives. May each of us who are entrusted with these virtues allow them to grow in all of our lives.

Next Sunday, August 14, we plan on having the kick-off of our school year with a Mass on the grass at 5:00 p.m. We ask you to bring your lawn chairs and/or blankets to this celebration which will take place next to Seton Hall. Again, this Mass will fulfill the Sunday obligation. In case of inclement weather, this Mass will be transferred to the church. Please join us as we begin our new school year with the Eucharist celebrated together as a parish family.

This Monday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation in the Church. However, since this solemnity falls on a Monday, the obligation is abrogated, meaning that it is not obligatory to attend Mass on that day. We will still have Mass at 8:00 a.m. to celebrate this Solemnity.

This week then ends for all purposes our summer vacation from school. Our first half-day of school will be Tuesday, August 16, followed by our first full day of school being Wednesday, August 17. Our teachers, administrators, and staff have been working hard preparing for these days, as they welcome our students to another year of challenging educational opportunities. As always, we expect the support and cooperation of our parents as we begin another school year. With God’s grace and blessing we begin the school year of 2022-23.

As we look ahead, I remind you that our parish picnic will be on Saturday, August 27, on the parish grounds. Because of the picnic, our Saturday afternoon Mass will be at 4:00 p.m. and not 5:00 p.m. Confessions will not be held that particular afternoon. I ask your prayers for a very successful parish picnic, that God will watch over our efforts, help us to enjoy each other and have a lot of fun, and that God will keep us safe and protected throughout the night.

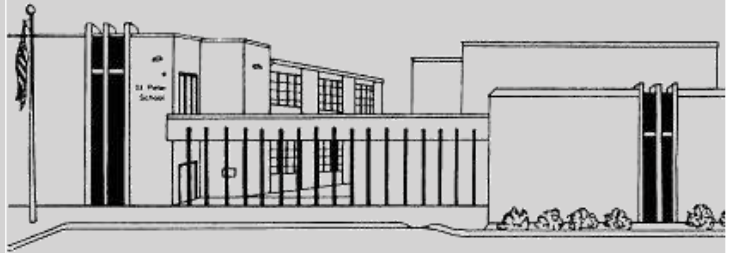
