Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time OCTOBER 2, 2022

Habakkuk 1:2-3,2:2-4; 2 Timothy 1:6-8,13-14; Luke 17:5-10

The key word today – found in all three Scripture readings – is *faith*. The first reading is a complaint against God for not intervening when we are in trouble. When things go wrong, we cry out to God, "Where are you? Why didn't you do something when we were in trouble?" God's answer is that we must wait with hope for his justice. The rash person lashes out and gives up. The righteous person lives by *faith*.

The second reading uses *faith* in a slightly different sense. By the time this epistle was written, there was a body of belief or doctrine. The author of 2 Timothy urges us to guard the "rich deposit of *faith.*" He means that we must always be loyal to the truths which the Lord has revealed. If we stick to those beliefs, we shall be saved.

In the Gospel, the apostles ask the Lord to increase their *faith*. He tells them that they could do almost anything if they had a little bit of faith. He then gets at the root of their problem: They always want everything to go their own way. This is the wrong attitude. They should want things to go the Lord's way. They should serve him loyally and ask for nothing more.

They should not be servants who do their job and expect their master to wait on them. When they have lived with absolute loyalty and faith, they must still say, "We are merely servants; we have done no more than our duty." Of course, if we live this way – in a spirit of real faith and loyalty to the Lord – he will richly reward us.

But we must not get the cart before the horse: We serve him because he is right. We do not serve him from a motive of reward, but simply because we want his will to be done. With this attitude, he will reward us for genuine faith.

Our celebration this weekend begins the month of October. I don't know about you, but September seemed to drag along without an end in sight. But this weekend celebrates the new month of October, with thoughts of a new season of the year just on the horizon. With the days getting shorter, the weather getting cooler, soon the elements of nature will be changing and we will be seeing before our eyes the beauty of creation preparing itself for the winter months.


Our first reading from the prophet Habakkuk is rather interesting and seems to reflect a common experience among us all. Some time throughout our lives we prayed and prayed for certain responses from God. And these prayers seem to go unanswered, leaving all of us questioning our God. In this reading, the prophet asks, "How long, O Lord?" This was the prophets question to God as the prophet was waiting for God to rescue Israel from her enemies. "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry to you, 'Violence!' but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin, why must I look at misery?" Sound familiar. Many of us who have faced difficult situations, sufferings, and trials, probably can relate to the words of this prophet. And God's answers to these pleas is that God will somehow triumph. In our gospel, the apostles faced similar situations that they did not understand. What they asked of Jesus is what we too ask of Him, namely, "Jesus, increase our faith." Help us to understand that you will answer our prayers, in some way that we may not see, nor understand. "Increase our faith!"

This next week, Quincy Notre Dame will be celebrating their homecoming week. The parade will be on Thursday evening, the game on Friday, and then the dance will be Saturday. As is our custom, we invite our young people to celebrate the 5:00 p.m. Mass with us on Saturday before their dance. So next Saturday, we welcome our young people to our Eucharist before their homecoming dance at QND.

Beginning this weekend and lasting through the month of October, we will be taking up our usual October count for the diocese. Because of COVID, this count is very important and hopefully will show that St. Peter Church has responded well to the invitation to return to the Eucharist on the weekends. I ask our ushers to make sure they use their fingers and toes in making sure that everyone is counted, and then they are to post this number in the ushers room.

This Tuesday, October 4, is the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. As most should know, Francis had a love of nature, including animals, as Francis saw God's presence in His creation. Because of Francis' love for creation, we will have a blessing of pets around 2:00 p.m. in the field next to Seton Hall. The parents of our children will be bringing their pets that afternoon for the children, and any adults may bring their own animals, to receive a special blessing that day. I will also make sure that I have my Abbie out there as she needs all the blessings that God can give to her. In her years with me, she has gotten a little spoiled and seems to be in need of many blessings as she has a tendency to think that she is in charge and wines when she's not. Sound familiar?


