Today we celebrate the **25<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time**. In the gospel story Jesus says to us, "No servant can serve two masters... You cannot serve both God and mammon." Jesus is referring to our relationship to money. We all make decisions daily in how we spend our money. We want to pay attention to even the smallest choices we make with regard to money. Are they consistent with the faith we profess?

Today is **Catechetical Sunday**. Today the Universal Church recognizes and blesses all those involved in sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ in many varied parish and school ministries. Here at Blessed Sacrament at all weekend Masses we honor and bless leaders and participants in the following parish/school catechetical ministries:

- \*Blessed Sacrament School Faculty and Staff
- \*DCC Catechists
- \*RCIA Team
- \*Quincy Spirit Team
- \*Children's Liturgy of the Word

This upcoming Friday, September 23, we will be taking our 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade students on a **Vocation Pilgrimage to Catholic St. Louis**. The purpose of this trip is to expose our students to the vocations of Marriage and Religious Life in the context of seeing some of the most beautiful Catholic religious spaces in St. Louis. Our itinerary will include:

- \*Visit with future priests (seminarians) at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary.
- \*Lunch in Forest Park with Vocation Director of Religious Sisters.
- \*Tour of St. Louis Cathedral Basilica
- \*Tour and Mass at Shrine of St. Joseph (w/homily on Marriage).
- \*Visit at Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters (Pink Sisters).

I would like to thank the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Assembly of the Quincy Knights of Columbus who have made a generous donation to help toward the expenses of this pilgrimage.

As a means to concluding the discussion on which Weekend Evening (Saturday or Sunday) should be the parish's weekend evening Mass, we are going to have an official **"Vote with our Feet."** For **8 weeks (Saturday, October 1 to Sunday, November 20)**, we are going to celebrate both Weekend Masses and count the attendance at both of these Masses:

**Saturday, 4:30 p.m. Mass**  
**Sunday, 5:00 p.m. Mass**

At the end of those 8 weeks, the Mass with the highest Mass count will become the parish's weekend evening Mass. The First Sunday of Advent (November 26-27) will have in place the Mass schedule of whatever has been chosen. Thank you to all the ministers who will be putting in extra work for these 8 weeks of 4-Mass weekends. Your time and help is very much appreciated.

This week I will be in Collinsville, Illinois, for our **Annual Diocesan Priests Convocation**. The priests of our diocese gather annually for 3 days of continuing education and formation. This year we will hear from Dr. Lawrence Feingold, Theology Professor at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis. The topic of his presentations will be *The Eucharist: Mystery of Presence, Sacrifice and Communion*.

Finally, I want to express our gratitude for all those who helped with last Saturday's **Septemberfest**. The Lord gave us great weather, and we had a great turnout from the parish and local community. I would like to thank all those who volunteered in many different capacities for Septemberfest. Many parish and school volunteers worked countless hours in preparation, set up, and clean up after the event. Thanks to all those who made donations to the Silent Auction, and to those who baked cakes and pies. Special thanks to the Men's Group who helped in many various capacities throughout the event. Finally, thanks to our dedicated Chairperson who brought our many talents together. I am very proud of our parish's wonderful work at this year's Septemberfest.

## Our Church History

St. Clare of Assisi, whose feast day is August 11, was born in Assisi, Italy in 1193. She was caught up in preaching and life of her fellow citizen St. Francis. She left her family and wealth to follow St. Francis. She joyfully lived this gospel life of poverty and simplicity and became the founder of an order of cloistered nuns now called the Poor Clares. She led a life that was austere, yet rich in works of charity and piety. She died in 1253 in the convent of San Damiano. She is portrayed with a gold vessel for the Blessed Sacrament in her right hand. She and her sisters were deeply devoted to the Most Holy Eucharist. She is the patron saint of televisions and computer screens.

September is recognized as Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Below are some staggering statistics related to facts about suicide. It is increasingly more prevalent in our younger generations. Historically, the Christian faith has had a tumultuous relationship in understanding and guidance for reaction and coping with death by suicide. It is well understood now that our greatest tool in combatting this rising problem is fortifying our Domestic Church and relationships within our community of faith.

### INDIVIDUAL IMPACT:

79% of all people who die by suicide are male.

Although more women than men attempt suicide, men are 4x more likely to die by suicide.

Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people aged 10-14 and the 3rd leading cause of death among people aged 15-24 in the U.S.

Suicide is the 12th leading cause of death overall in the U.S.

46% of people who die by suicide had a diagnosed mental health condition, but research shows that 90% may have experienced symptoms of a mental health condition.

### COMMUNITY IMPACT:

· Annual prevalence of serious thoughts of suicide by U.S. demographic group:

4.9% of all adults.

11.3% of young adults aged 18-25.

18.8% of high school students.

45% of LGBTQ youth.
