

Hancock County Churches Eucharistic Parish Mission We are pleased to announce that Father Luke Spannagel, who served our churches from 2003 to 2007 and was largely responsible for the renovation and renewal of Immaculate Conception Church and parish community life, advanced by Fr. Szydlik's fruitful priestly ministry, is coming to us for a Eucharistic Mission! Fr. Luke will be here for the weekend Masses of October 22 and 23. And then, between the evening of the 23rd and the 28th, will be present at each of our churches for an evening conference – concluding with a Mass, explained step by step, so that we better understand why the celebration of the Eucharist is structured the way it is. Given the shortage of priests, while Fr. Luke is here, I'll be in Peoria helping with what ordinarily are his parish responsibilities. By Friday evening the 28th, we'll all be back where we belong – and here comes the Bishop for Confirmation! Spread the word, everyone: Catholic and non-Catholic alike. People everywhere will remember Fr. Luke.

Deacons begin preaching on September 24. Our deacons, Dan Moffitt and Tony Herdrich, will begin a monthly responsibility for preaching at our Masses, beginning the weekend of September 24, and the fourth weekend of every month. We look forward to the gift of the Holy Spirit through the words of their preaching! Needless to say...which means here it comes, we're going to say it!...Give them your attention, your support, and your affirmation as they begin this dimension of their ministry as deacons. And remember: your deacons are here for you. As is Monsignor "Fr. Paul." As I am. There are no turf battles here. Never will be. A deacon can baptize. If you want one of our deacons to officiate at Baptism in your family, you don't have to ask me: ask them. They can lead a funeral outside of Mass, and preach there, even during a funeral Mass. If you want one of them to preach, let me know. No need to explain, apologize, or worry about how I'd take it. I'd take it just fine, thank you. They can officiate at a burial service instead of me: make your desires known. Same goes for Fr. Paul — with this understanding, though, one he has expressed several times. He is retired; he wants to help, but he doesn't want to be overly extended. If he declines your request, understand. He's not preferring others over you; there's a limit to what he is able to do. Look: we're all here for you! The only slight we would feel, would be if you didn't come our way at all.







